Thirteen Local Students At U.B.C. Now—Active in Various Spheres Notably Sport

Prince Rupert's representation at University of B.C. now stands at thirteen—the latest addition being Garfield McKinley, who came over from Victoria College after Christmas to continue his work in second year arts.

Two are scheduled to graduate this spring. Irene Mitchell will become a full-fledged high school teacher while Bob Fraser will receive his degree in Mining Engineering. Bob Matheson is completing his fourth year in Mining and Bill Patmore is taking third year honors in Geology. He obtained a first-class mark in his exams in that subject before Christmas. In addition to playing on the Senior B basketball team he placed second in the three-mile event; in a recent, inter-faculty track meet and second in the half-mile in the interclass meet.

Ronnie Allen is also continuing his interest in track and will travel as a half-miler with the track team to Washington for a meet with the College of Puget Sound this month. Jack Cade meanwhile works off his surplus energy skiing on Grouse Mountain on Sundays with the Outdoors Club.

George Minns travelled with the Varsity swimming team to Washington University recently and won points for B.C. by placing third in the 200 yard freestyle. Bishop Tuurber has also been travelling, having risen to a position on the first string soccer team, while he won first place in the high jump in the interfaculty meet.

Other names well known to Prince Rupert appearing in news of campus activities are Bill Gwyer, who took part in the rowing meet—between Varsity and the Vancouver Rowing Club recently and Bill Sargent, holder of the leading roll in "Caesar and Cleopatra," the Players Club spring production for this year.

J. M. Cummings, mining engineer of Vancouver, arrived in the city from the south on the Prince George this morning, being here to inspect mineral properties on this part of the coast on behalf of interests which he represents.

"CATHERINE THE GREAT"

Elizabeth Bergner and Douglas Fairbanks Jr. Shine in Fine Film

Another picture of historical interest such as are much in favor just now, "Catherine the Great," the latest effort of Alexander Korda, whose genius gave "Henry VIII," comes to the Capitol Theatre this mid-week. In the title role is Elizabeth Bergner, beautiful young Viennese star.

The picture, a British production, picks up Catherine's career at the Russian court of the Empress Elizabeth upon the day of her arrival to wed the erratic young Archduke Peter and gives a fairly complete chronicle of her dramatic life thenceforward.

Miss Bergner brings to the delineation of "little Catherine" a fire that has been described as genius. The portrayal of Douglas Fairbanks Jr. as the neurotic Peter is said to be the finest work of his career and a worthy complement to Miss Bergner's characterization. Flora Robson, one of England's leading actresses, has the role of the notorious Empress Elizabeth. Sir Gerald du Maurier, who bears a distinguished name in the English theatre, is excellent as the confidential valet.

Lavishly investitured and handsomely mounted, "Catherine the Great" is a glorious spectacle.
