BURNS IS HONORED

Splendid Banquet Held at Presbyterian Church to Celebrate Memory of Scotia's Bard

The "Immortal Memory" of Robert Burns was fittingly honored last night in the social hall of First Presbyterian Church when a large gathering sat down at the annual banquet of the Women's Auxiliary of that church held in observance of the one hundred and seventy-fifth anniversary of the birth of Auld Scotia's national bard. A splendid dinner, including The Hagis wi' a' the honors, was served by the ladies after which an excellent program of music and speeches was presented, the feature address of the evening being that on "The Immortal Memory" which was delivered impressively by Thomas McClymont.

There was much enthusiasm during the dinner when The Hagis was borne around the tables by Murdo McLeod, being piped into the hall in the ancient ceremonial manner by Piper Sam Leslie. W. M. Brown, in his well known style, recited "The Address to a Hagis."

Rev. W. D. Grant Hollingworth, the pastor, was in the chair and other speakers, besides Mr. McClymont, included City Commissioner W. J. Alder, who responded to the toast to "Our City" which was proposed by Dr. L. W. Kergin; Ex-Mayor Cyril H. Orme, proposing the toast "Brethren A" which was responded to by H. N. Brocklesby, and Mrs. Joseph T. Mandy, who responded to the toast to "The Lassies" which was proposed by W. M. Blackstock.

There were vocal solos by Mrs. William Millar, Mrs. J. H. McLeod and J. Melville, with Mrs. E. J. Smith, Miss Maizie Macdonald and Mrs. J. S. Black as accompanists, while selections by a Scottish orchestra consisting of John Bremner, J. B. MacKay and James Watt, as usual, proved very popular.

The proceedings opened with the Toast to the King and the singing of the National Anthem, closing with the community singing of "Auld Lang Syne."
