## LEADERSHIP INCREASED

**Cardinals Consolidate Position in National League—Nip and Tuck in American**

CINCINNATI, June 1: (CP)—By defeating the Reds in a close game here yesterday, the St. Louis Cardinals increased their margin of leadership in the National League to one and a half games. The New York Giants, losing to the Dodgers at Brooklyn, found that the Chicago Cubs, winning over the Pittsburgh Pirates at Wrigley Field, had joined them in a tie for second place. The Pirates dropped into a tie for fourth place with the idle Boston Braves.

In the American League, the Indians lost to Chicago White Sox at Cleveland but retained their one half game lead over New York Yankees who lost to the Washington Senators at the Yankee Stadium.

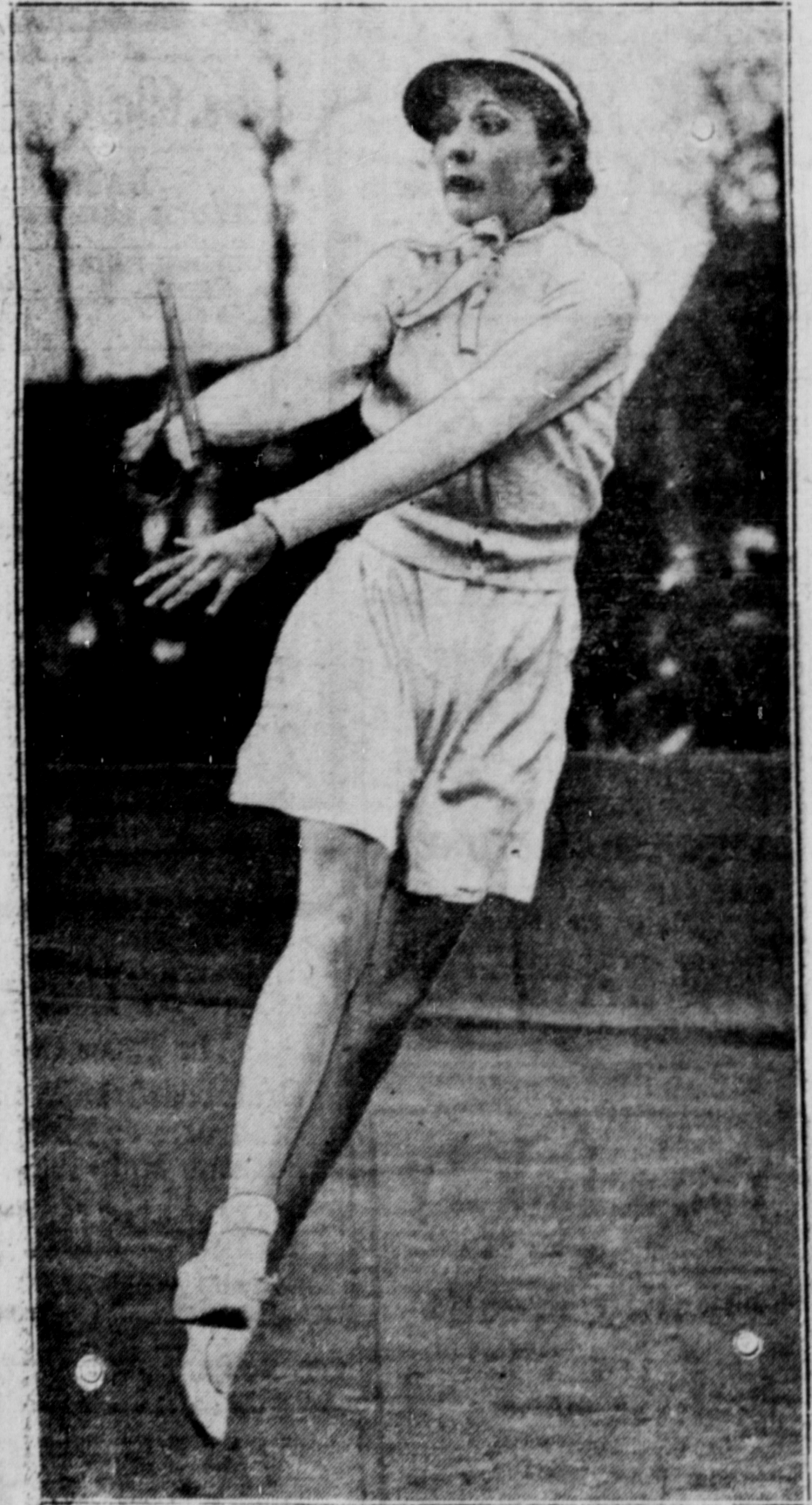
