Librarian's Report

The report of the librarian showed a total of 5099 books loaned during the month of February-3534 fiction, 615 non-fiction, 63 duplicate pay and 887 juvenile. The average per day for the twenty days the library was open was 254.9 books. Eighteen new borrowers were listed during the month with fifteen cancelled, making the total number of library users 3782 or three more than the previous month.

During the month 75 new books had been acquired by gift while 51 had been discarded, making a total of 8797 books on the shelves-24 more than in the month previous


