WHIFFLETS From the Waterfront

With a fair sized list of passengers, C. N. R. steamer Prince George, Capt. Neil McLean, arrived in port on time at 10 o'clock this morning from Vancouver, Powell River and Ocean Falls and sails at 4 o'clock this afternoon for Anyox and Stewart whence she will return here tomorrow evening southbound. The vessel yesterday afternoon had her roughest crossing of Queen Charlotte Sound in years, officers reported on arriving here.

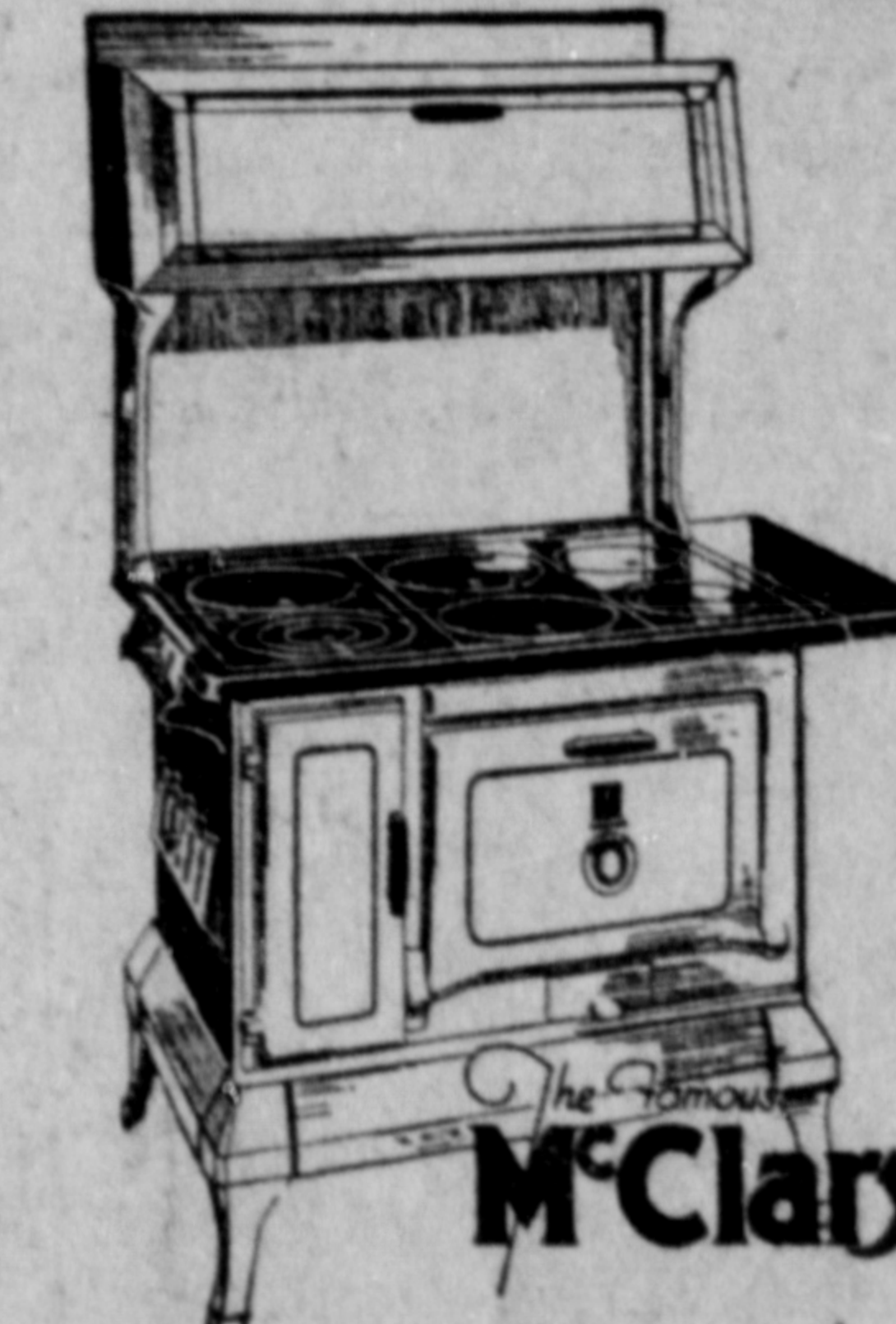
