Sea Serpent Snap Shots

While we may feel a little like a suddenly burst balloon following Dr. W. A. Clemens' announcement that our much-touted "sea serpent" is merely a basking shark, which they tell us is more or less common in northern waters, we can at least say that there was a lot of fun while it lasted. The public as well as the newspapers the world over entered fully into the spirit of the occasion and it made a lot of diversion. And it must not be overlooked that Prince Rupert got a great deal of publicity out of it and, unquestionably, a lot of new people the world over found out that we are on the map. If for nothing more than mere gratitude for all this, we should see that our "sea serpent's" remains are suitably preserved and placed in our local Hall of Fame.

If Dr. Clemens had only been kind enough to hold off his positive identity for a day or so, Prince Rupert might have become a Mecca for the scientific world. Some of the leading zoologists and biologists of the country had their attention attracted by the find and were talking about coming here to assist in the identity if they were required. Among these was Dr. Trevor Kincaid, head of the department of zoology of the University of Washington, who expressed willingness to come to Prince Rupert to examine the monster. In fact the Daily News was asked by the Associated Press to arrange for Dr. Kincaid to be invited here but Dr. Neal Carter, director of the Prince Rupert Fisheries Experimental Station, who knows Dr. Kincaid personally, felt that, before extending such an invitation, Dr. Clemens and possibly a member of the University of British Columbia staff should first be given a chance to express their opinions.

In addition to being asked to cable an article to the London Daily Mail descriptive of the monster, Dr. Carter on Saturday was called on long distance telephone by a Portland newspaper in regard to the matter. Other publications had also asked him for signed articles on the subject.

During the past summer, a couple of Skeena River salmon fishermen are reported to have had some sort of a monster tangled up in their net while fishing. This was off Oceanic cannery. Thinking nothing of it, they threw the tail aside after having cut it off. Possibly, it might have been a basking shark, it is now thought.

Meantime, reports continue to grow in number of fishermen and other local folk having seen in the past while on the water creatures such as this monster skeleton might have been in life. At least two stories are to be heard of them having been seen in the harbor. Have you seen your serpent yet? If not, come up and see one some time!

Dr. C. W. Gilmore of the Smithsonian Institute, who has just identified a fossilized vertebrae as belonging to a sea serpent which lived fifty-five million years ago, still doesn't believe sea serpents exist today. "I always feel they are myths," he says, "or else they turn out to be a whale or some other creature well known." He predicted that the remains at Prince Rupert would fall within some known classification.

SPORT CHAT

Toronto Maple Leafs defeated Detroit Red Wings at the Maple Leaf Gardens in Toronto Saturday night by a score of 3 to 2, making it their seventh straight victory without a defeat since the National Hockey League season opened. The Leafs have now defeated every team in the League this season with the exception of the New York Rangers whom they are scheduled to play tonight. Saturday night's game was a real thriller played before a crowd of 13,000 howling fans. Play was rather rough at times and on one occasion there were no less than five players in the penalty box. Good-fellow of Detroit was the principal offender, being sent off the ice twice.

Harvey Jackson was again the scoring ace for the Maple Leafs, making two goals, the first in the first period on a pass from Charlie Conacher and the second in the third when, with thirteen minutes to go, he went right through unassisted to net one of the greatest goals that had been seen on the local ice. Nick Metz, scoring his first counter in major league hockey, netted the third and winning goal for Toronto from right in front of the net on a pass from Conacher with eight and a half minutes to go.

Aurey banged the puck in for Red Wings' first score two minutes and fifty-eight seconds after the start of the third period after a rush down the ice led by Whelan who was credited with the assist. A determined siege of the Toronto net with a power play in the closing stages of the game resulted in another goal for Detroit from the stick of Anderson in a scramble in front of the net with five minutes to go. The Red Wings were however, unable to score again.

The Maroons and Canadiens played at Montreal Saturday night, the Maroons winning three to one. By the end of the second period, Maroons had scored twice, each team netting the puck once in the third period. After an even first half in which each team scored once, the Boston Bruins ran away from the St. Louis Eagles at St. Louis to win four to one. The Eagles were again the victims of the Red Wings at Detroit Sunday night, the Wings, as a result, taking exclusive possession of third place ahead of the New York Rangers who were losing to the Americans in New York.
