It is also understood that some of the members of the Prince Rupert Fisheries Experimental Station are hardly satisfied as yet. As much information of a descriptive nature as possible and probably further samples will be sent to Dr. Clemens to assist him in checking up his finding. Meantime, it should be remembered that Dr. Clemens is a recognized authority on such matters and that there are probably none here any more competent to question his identification than there are to definitely identify the creature.


