LONDON, Nov. 27: (CP)-Three Kings, George of England, Christian of Denmark and Haakon of Norway, with their Queens sat down together last night in Buckingham Palace at a dinner given by King George in honor of Princess Marina and the Duke of Kent who are to be married on Thursday. The affair was held in the gorgeous white and gold state dining room. Magnificent gold plate, one of the most costly possession of the King, was used. It was a glittering contrast to the quiet and inexpensive home life to which the Princess was accustomed before her engagement.
