MARKET PRICE IN NEW YORK RESPONDS TO TREASURY BUYING AND JUMPS TO 491c-DE-DUCTION FOR SHRINKAGE PROVIDED, CUR-RENCY BEING PAID FOR REMAINDER.

WASHINGTON, D.C., Aug. 9: (CP)-President Franklin D. Roosevelt today issued an executive order providing for the nationalization of silver at 50.01c per ounce according to provisions of the Silver Purchase Act of 1934 passed at the last session of Congress. All mints will be directed to receive any and all silver in the United States, deducting as shrinkage sixty-one and eight twenty-fifths of silver so received and returning to the depositors silver certificates or other currency in an amount to the monetary value of the remainder.

Gold in Small Quantities Taken From Islander Now Beached on Admiralty Id.
