### WHO ARE THESE WELSHMEN?

"The English take their greatness for granted. The Scots proclaim theirs so loudly that you cannot help hearing them, while the Welsh—well, they are so very old and so well bred that they prefer to talk about their failings." That is the statement of a prominent Welshman when writing about his own countrymen. The same authority assures the world that the pure and simple Welshman like the pure and simple Englishman is a myth. Wales has had its heroes, its grafters, its labor leaders and its men who amassed fortunes, just as has England and America.

This is St. David's Day, and St. David was the patron saint of the Welsh people at a time when patron saints were popular. Today we hear about St. David only once a year and then only as a passing reference.

Fewer than a million Welsh people speak the Welsh language and many of those learned it in Sunday School. The Welshman is born with a tendency to music, oratory, poetry and religion. The Esteddof is a national institution at which the finest music may be heard. When the fancy of the poet is given free rein it is apt to be misunderstood. It is the ability to paint in beautiful colors that makes Welsh people good salesmen and preachers. It is said that the English people are honest except when they have reason to be otherwise but the Welsh can never be depended upon to tell the truth when in poetic mood.

At one time the Welsh were strangers to the rest of the world. Today they are recognized as jolly good fellows, hospitable to a degree, and with a sense of humor that their English neighbors cannot always understand. They are found in every part of the world and their democratic tendencies have had a leavening effect everywhere.

C. F.

What a compliment indeed! After so many explanations made to the people by its authoritative representative in this city! Take a few sentences from your recent editorial, "The C. L. D. You must know that this argument is based on mere piffle and is entirely illogical, a position taken, and entirely untenable. What is the primary reason for revolutions to which you are so pleased to point? Dare you give the basic reasons of such cataclysmic phenomena? Has the C. C. F. ever declared itself ready to enter upon such a course if possible of being avoided? Does the C. C. F. stand for what you infer they do, unconstitutional activities?

If you cannot afford to tell the whole truth respecting the purposes and aims of the C.C.F., I am ready to do so, in defence of the righteousness of its principles as opposed to your unwarranted onslaughts attempted. Let us have no more "Campaign Echoes." I was hoping we had passed beyond the repetition of any such articles again.

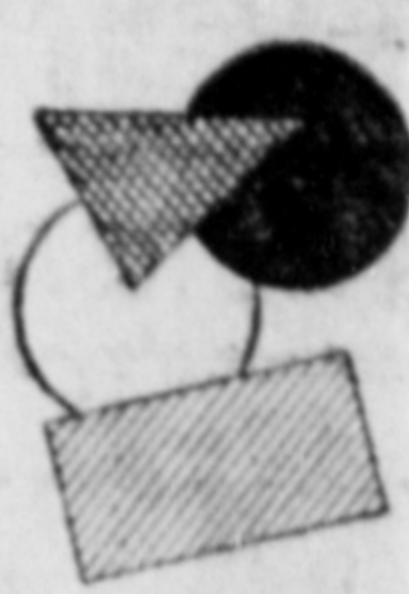

The repair job is now almost completed and work of annual overhaul of the vessel is being at present carried out. Ten members of the George's crew arrived from Vancouver on the Prince Rupert yesterday.

After the Prince George has been finished, she will be recommissioned in service and the steamer Prince Rupert will be withdrawn for her annual overhaul at the local yard.

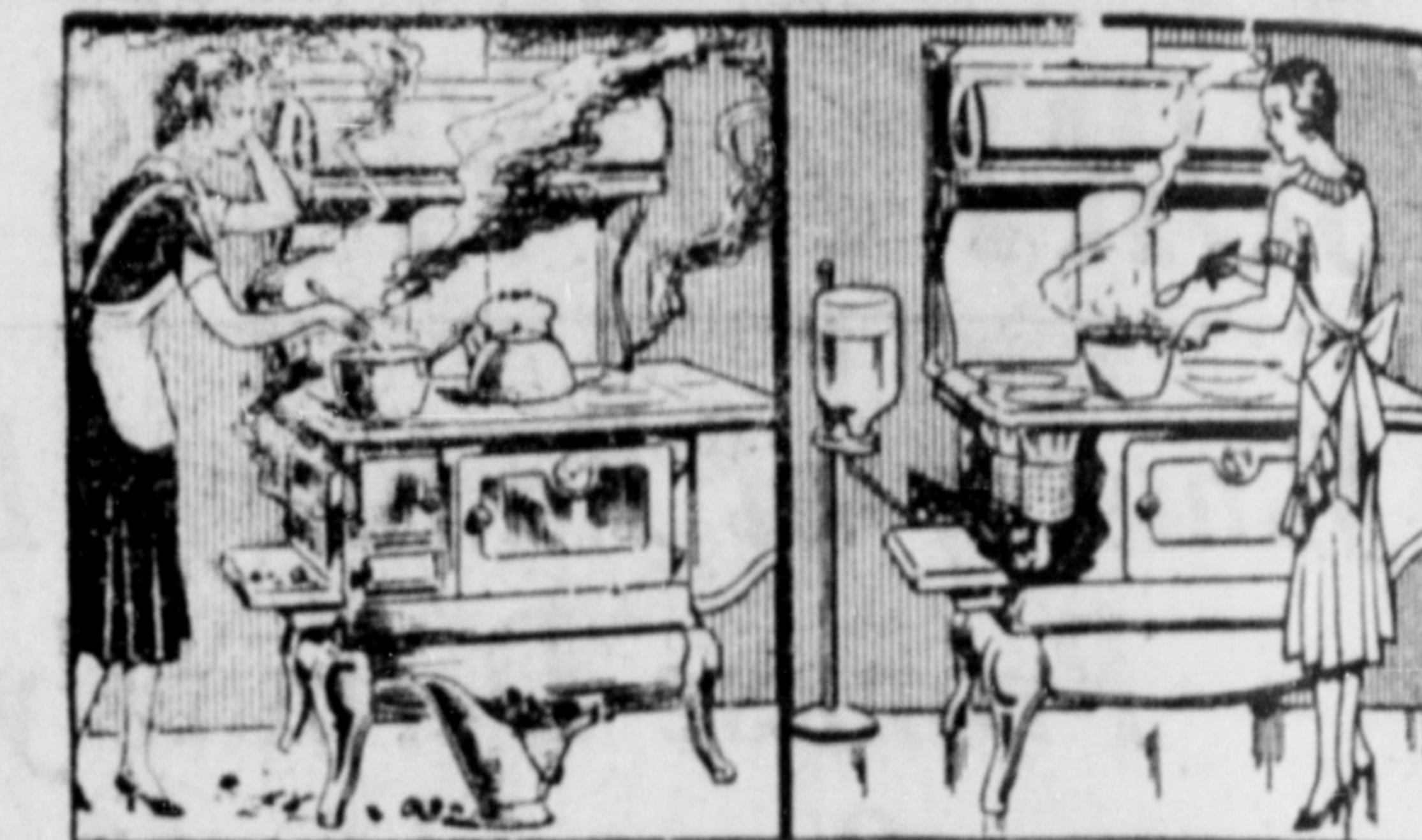
