WHIFFLETS

From the Waterfront

North Island Trolling Beginning to Fall Off—Pinks on West Coast—Fall Phase of Salmon Canning.

After one of the best runs in years which has proven profitable to several hundred troll fishermen, spring salmon fishing is beginning to slacken off around North Island and other trolling grounds at the north end of the Queen Charlotte Islands. The run of cohoes is continuing, however, and it is expected will soon show an improvement. With the falling off of the spring run, some of the boats are commencing to drift away from the North Island trolling grounds.

The run of pink salmon in Massett Inlet, which has been awaited since the first of the month, has not commenced but hopes are still held that it will soon materialize. Meantime the Massett Cannery cannery at Old Massett and the Nootka Packing Co. cannery at New Massett are getting supplies of pinks from the west coast of Graham Island where it is reported that a run of some proportions had developed.

Skeena River canneries are now beginning to enter the fall fishing phase of the season's operations. The sockeye run has fallen off and the season for this variety will close this week-end. Cohoes are still being taken by the gillnetters, however, and the very satisfactory price of 40c per fish is being paid. The seiners are getting 4c and 5c for pinks and there is considerable demand for this variety. The Canadian Fishing Co.'s cannery at Haysport is the only salmon packing plant on the Skeena River to cease operations with the closing of the sockeye season.

On her regular weekly northern voyage, Union steamer Catala, Capt. A. E. Dickson, arrived in port at 8 o'clock last evening from the south and sailed a couple of hours later for Anyox. Stewart and other northern points whence she will return here southbound tomorrow. The vessel brought north a good list of passengers including twenty-six round trippers.

Completing her final voyage of the summer tourist season to Alaska, C. P. R. steamer Princess Charlotte, Capt. W. Q. Palmer, with a large party of round trip passengers on board, was in port from 4 o'clock Saturday afternoon to 5:30 from Skagway and other northern points enroute to Vancouver. The Charlotte had 239 passengers on board, eight disembarking here and three sailing from here for the south aboard her.

Union steamer Cardena, Capt. Ernest Georgeson, arrived in port at 9:45 p.m. Friday from the south, sailing at 12 midnight on her return to Vancouver and waypoints.

With a total of 207 passengers on board, ten of whom disembarked here, C. N. R. steamer Prince George, Capt. H. E. Nedden, arrived in port at 8:30 this morning following a regular voyage to Alaska and sailed at 3 o'clock this afternoon for Ocean Falls. Powell River and Vancouver. The large majority of the George's passengers were round trip tourists returning south.

Following a three weeks' cruise of Alaskan waters with Freeman F. Gosden of Chicago, "Amos" member of the famous radio entertainment team of "Amos 'n' Andy," Mrs. Gosden, William M. Dewey Jr., Chicago hotel manager, and Mrs. Dewey, the Seattle charter yacht Caroline, Capt. K. C. (Casey) Moran arrived in port late last night from the north. The party disembarked here after a delightful cruise which was featured by some successful angling expeditions. Mr. and Mrs. Gosden sailed on the steamer Prince George this afternoon for Vancouver enroute home while the rest of the party will proceed East by train this evening. On arrival at Seattle "Amos" plans to greet "Andy" the other member of the party, in England by long distance telephone.

Persistent rumors are still heard here that the Canadian National Steamships big liner Prince Robert, which has been tied up at Vancouver for the past two years, will be coming soon to the local dry dock

to undergo an extensive overhaul preparatory to being commissioned next winter in a new run between Vancouver and California and Mexico. As yet, there is no local confirmation of the report.

After having loaded canned salmon at Massett Inlet canneries, C. N. R. steamer Prince John, Capt. Dan McKinnon, sailed from there last night for Nanaimo where she will load more canned salmon, taking the whole cargo into Vancouver. The Prince John is being operated in tramp freighting during the summer.

Imperial Oil Co.'s tanker Imperial, Capt. A. S. McGaw, arrived in port at 4 o'clock yesterday morning from Ioco with a cargo of fuel for the company's local tanks and sailed at 3:30 in the afternoon on her return to Ioco via Powell River.

During the past week there has been a marked falling off in the coho run for the trollers of Dundas and Stevens Island, the fish having almost disappeared. However, it is expected there will be a revival of the run before long.

Having been delayed by fog early this morning, C. P. R. steamer Princess Louise, Capt. Thomas Cliff, arrived in port at 10:45 a.m. today from Vancouver and sailed at noon for Skagway and other Alaska points. The vessel had a large number of round trip tourist passengers on board, her total list numbering 206. Two disembarked from the vessel here while one person left aboard her for Ketchikan.

Jack McAuley, happening to be on his power cruiser Carmona at the Canadian National Yacht Club's floats yesterday, effected the rescue of a Japanese boy who took a plunge into the water with a bicycle while sitting at the edge of the government dock on the vehicle. The lad was none the worse for the immersion.
