Noble Missionaries

Archdeacon Collison and his family, were instrumental in bringing about many of the conditions that exist today, on the north end of Graham Island. Twenty-eight years ago they were assisted by the Rev. C. Harrison who is still hale and hearty and has made his home on the island for that number of years.
