Gardening In Prince Rupert

There is a tendency among gardeners to try to make their gardens like other people's instead of striking a new note for themselves. Some like a formal garden and others like it informal. A good example of the informal kind is that of Mr. and Mrs. J. C. McLennan on Borden Street. Everyone passing that way must have noticed the wonderful effect from the wild daisies on the bank above the road. Nothing could have been prettier and they bloomed at a time when there was little else available. The danger is that they may be allowed to spread.

The McLennan garden has wonderful possibilities. Not only is the approach excellent but the rugged rocks at the back lend themselves particularly well to rock gardening. The wonderful cedar trees are something that could not be purchased or grown within a reasonable period. Roses do well there and so do a great many other flowers. There are very few places so endowed by nature as this and the artistic touch of the owners has added to the natural beauty.

Recently mention was made in these columns of the rose "Darla" shown by C. H. Orme at the rose show. It seems that a number of people have this rose in the collection introduced from Victoria in the spring. Edide Smith on Atlin Avenue has been picking them from his rose garden and A. J. Lancaster also has the same variety.

It is at present one of the show places in Westview and anyone interested in the judicious decorative effect of pinkish should see it.
