GENERAL STRIKE IN 'FRISCO TODAY

Eighty Thousand Workers Quit Jobs and Many Other Thousand Involved—Condition Resembles That of Wartime Siege—Spread is Feared

SAN FRANCISCO, July 16:—San Francisco became tied up this morning with a general strike of virtually all union labor—the latest phase in the longshoremen's strike situation.

National Guard troops with tanks, machine guns and one-pounders immediately converged upon the stricken area following the strike being made effective.

Under a virtual state of wartime siege, the entire Bay district is crippled and roving bands of pickets attempted a complete stoppage of food supplies to the population of a million and a quarter persons.

Spread of the general strike to Los Angeles, Portland and Seattle is said here to be possible.

ATTEMPT AT DISARMAMENT

GENEVA, July 16:—The world powers committed themselves on Saturday to another serious effort at disarmament next September by official convocation of the steering committee of the disarmament conference.

William John Alder, Son of City Commissioner, Here, Passes Away

In addition to the parents, who will have the deep sympathy of many local friends, deceased is survived by a sister, Mrs. F. G. Brynildsen of Seattle, and two brothers, George Alder in California and Harold Alder, who is now studying law in Toronto.
