## WATERFRONT WHIFFS

**Overhaul of Prince John Starts at Local Dry Dock—Two Destroyers Here Next Week—Tank Barge is Complete Loss**

Overhaul work has just started at the local dry dock on the Canadian National Steamships coastal steamer Prince John, which arrived this week from Vancouver via the Queen Charlotte Islands, with Capt. William Gleeson in command. The vessel will be taken on to the pontoons on Monday for hull work and will be in the yard until the end of this month when it is expected

she will go back in commission on the run between Prince Rupert and Vancouver via the Queen Charlotte Islands—probably two weeks from tonight. The Prince Charles, which has been operating on this run during the summer, will then be withdrawn from service and tied up for the winter at the dry dock here.

Ronald Pitcher and Pat Palmer, ratings of the local unit of the Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, who sailed Thursday night for naval barracks at Esquimalt, expect to be away for four months taking training which will include a cruise down the California coast aboard the Canadian destroyer H. M. C. S. Skeena.

Next week will be Canadian Navy week in Prince Rupert with both H. M. C. S. Skeena and H. M. C. S. Vancouver in port in the course of a coastal cruise. The two destroyers will arrive on Monday and remain until Friday. The ships and their officers and men will be welcome here and it is understood there will be modest entertainment accorded them.

There were ninety-two passengers aboard C. P. R. steamer Princess Louise, Capt. Thomas Cliff, which was in port from 3:45 to 5:30 yesterday afternoon southbound from Skagway to Vancouver. Eight persons disembarked from the vessel here while four went south aboard her from this port. The Princess Louise will make her next call here northbound on Thursday morning of next week.

B. E. Bailey of the scientific staff of the Prince Rupert Fisheries Experimental Station sailed yesterday afternoon on the Princess Louise for a vacation trip to Victoria.

**Tank Barge Total Loss**  
The Union Oil Co.'s tank barge, which has been located on the North Island trolling grounds during the fishing season for several years, is a total loss following a fire which broke out aboard the craft on Friday night of last week. All equipment and effects on board were totally destroyed and Ingvald Stromness, who was on board the power vessel Sea Queen which was moored alongside at the time, and Mrs. George Smith, wife of the company's agent in charge of the barge, whose home was on board, suffered burns which made it necessary to bring them to the Prince Rupert General Hospital for treatment. Of the barge itself nothing is left worth salvaging so it to be removed and taken away to be sunk, James Adam, engineer in charge of floating equipment for the Union Oil Co., came north from Vancouver following the fire, returning south on the Princess Louise yesterday afternoon. It is expected the barge will be replaced next season.

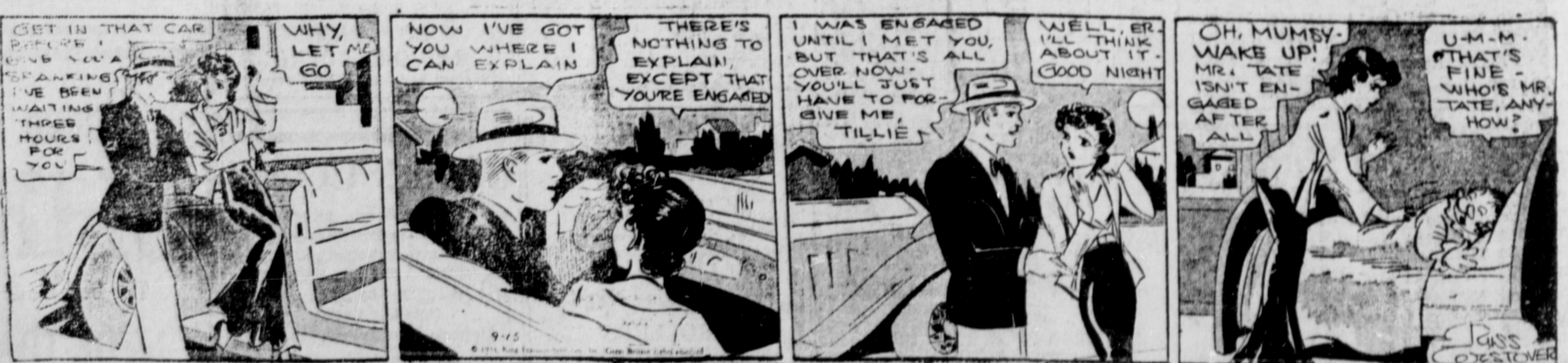
