

## MUST FORK OUT SECOND \$200

Josephine Reda of Klondyke Hotel Found Guilty Today of Running a Blind Pig.

Josephine Reda—proprietrix of the Klondyke Hotel who was yesterday fined \$200 for letting an Indian have a bottle of whisky, was today charged with running a blind pig. She was found guilty and fined a second \$200.

A number of witnesses were to have appeared on her behalf all with the same story that they had clubbed together to buy a barrel of beer and a bottle or two of whisky. Chief Vickers who discovered a team load of ingeniously concealed liquor and empty bottles in the place, knew better, and Magistrate McMullin soon sized up the worth of the evidence.

Accused appeared before Magistrate McMullin wearing a tight grey suit with mouse-colored velvet trimming upon the collar and a lofty turban to match trimmed with black veiling, a large aigrette and diamond buckles. She gasped when she heard she had to find a second \$200 and hinted that heaven alone knew where she was to discover the money.

She was allowed an hour or two, to approach her source of information and produce \$202—her fine and costs—or choose the alternative of a three months holiday at New Westminster.

Quite a large quantity of whisky, and other intoxicating liquor in bottles similar to that found upon the Indian was discovered in the place. The woman faced the second charge this forenoon.

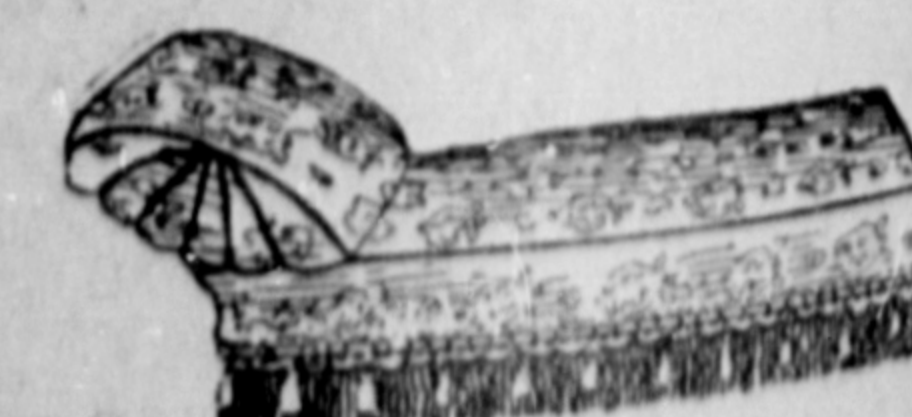
