WILL HOLD FIRST SHOW

Horticultural Society Decides on Rose and Flower Show During July and Possibly Dahlia Show Later

The Prince Rupert Horticultural Society at a general meeting last night in the Council Chamber of the City Hall, H. F. Pullen presiding, decided to put on its first annual rose and flower show and the executive was empowered to proceed and make all necessary arrangements and to set the date for the show as soon as it was determined when the roses would be at their best bloom.

It is planned to have other flowers as well as roses but to particularly stress the rose exhibit. Possibly later in the season a dahlia show may be held or a general flower show. Much depends upon the success of the first effort.

A proposal made by Mrs. J. T. Mandy was that a slogan competition should be held in connection with the rose show in which a prize should be offered for the best slogan symbolic of horticulture in its relation to Prince Rupert such as "Prince Rupert, the City of Roses" or "The City that Rains Roses." The proposal will be adopted and a suitable prize will be secured and rules for the contest laid down.

A proposal coming from Dr. J. T. Mandy was that an effort be made to secure a challenge cup to be up for competition, either as a perpetual challenge cup or to be won so many times before becoming the property of the winner. This would be awarded in connection with the rose exhibit, possibly to the person making the best individual exhibit or the best display of roses. It was suggested that possibly one of the parliamentary representatives for the district or some other person interested in rose culture might wish to donate such a cup.

On motion of Frank Dibb, a committee was appointed to have charge of the collecting of data in regard to the time of year when flowers were in bloom and the dates when planting should be carried out. This committee consists of Tom Silversides, Theo Coltart and Laurie Lambly.

The name of F. J. Fuller was added to the executive of the association.

Secretary Charles Evitt reported on the recent importation of rose trees which was very successful. A vote of thanks to those who helped in connection with the distribution and with the importation generally was passed, those specifically mentioned being F. J. Fuller, Fred Rif-
