## Glands Discussed By Physician at Rotary Luncheon

Dr. W. T. Kergin gave an intensely interesting address at the Rotary Club luncheon yesterday on the subject of "Internal Secreting Glands." He explained that there was another type such as the salivary glands and the pancreas. These had outlets. The internal glands had no ducts, yet had the power of activating both body and mind and were immensely important. All the functions of these glands were not yet known but some

affected growth and development and others had the effect of changing the whole physical and mental nature.

One of the internal glands, the doctor explained, was the thyroid, the over-development of which was known as goitre.

At the close the chairman, W. M. Blackstock, thanked the speaker for his interesting and instructive address and expressed the hope that he would further elaborate on the theme at some subsequent meeting.
