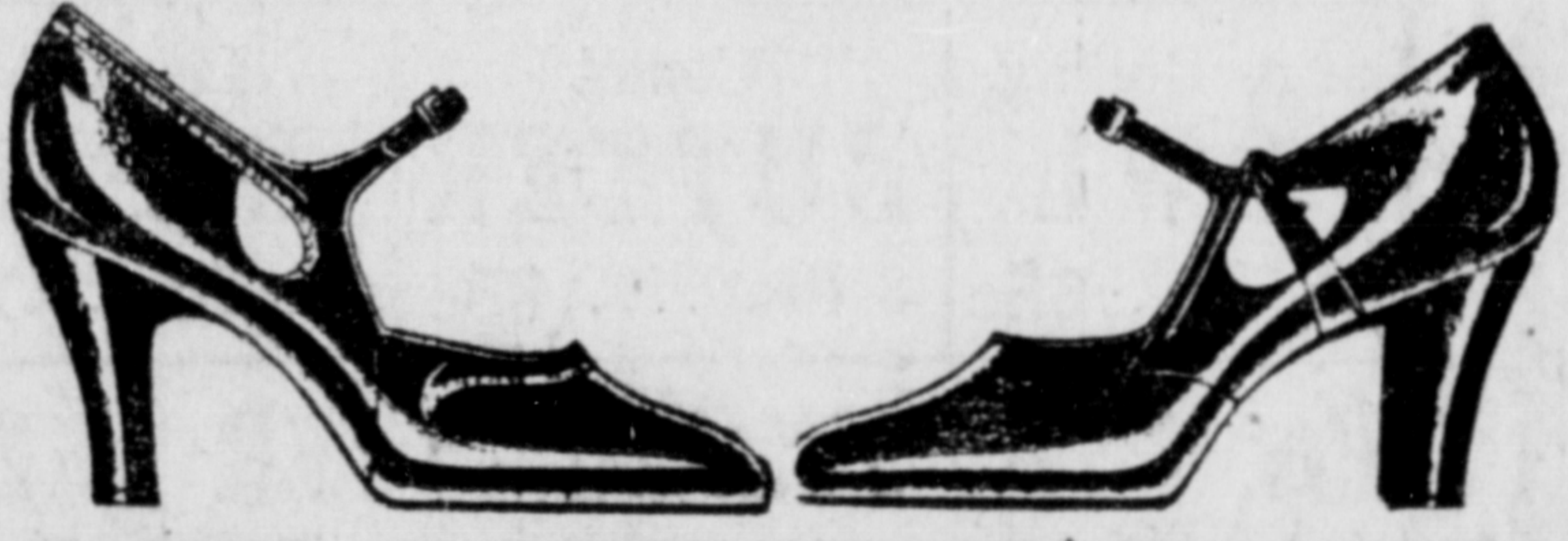

MERCHANTS HAVE MEET

Endorse Plan to Curb Chain Store Development—George Hill Elected President

The Prince Rupert Retail Merchants' Association, at a general meeting yesterday afternoon, endorsed a resolution, proposed by the Fraser Valley Retail Exchange and approved by the Union of British Columbia Municipalities and the Fraser Valley Reeves' Association, urging the provincial government to enact legislation to provide a sliding scale of taxes which would have the effect of curbing the development of the chain store system. Under the proposal these taxes would range from \$2.50 per year for a single store up to \$1000 per store for retail organizations having 21 or more branches. One half of the revenue so derived, it is proposed, would go for the benefit of hospitals and the other half to the municipalities with one-half of this to be earmarked for school purposes.

The meeting, which also discussed hours of store closing on Saturday evenings, deciding to defer action until the next meeting, elected officers for the year as follows:

GONE CRAZY WITH HEAT

Steam Just That and Ice is Water Gone Crazy With Cold—Interesting Lecture By J. E. Boddie

"All the elaborate machinery you see in a modern-refrigerating plant is mainly for one purpose, that is, the removal of heat," stated J. E. Boddie, chief engineer for the Canadian Fish & Cold Storage Co. in addressing the Rotary Club on "Refrigeration" at its weekly luncheon yesterday. "This heat may be taken from water to make ice, from air to make it more comfortable to breathe, from meat, fish, fruits or vegetables to slow up the rate of decay, and last, but not least, to remove heat that will filter through the walls, floor, ceiling or roof of any refrigerating plant."

Mr. Boddie explained that heat flowed from a warm substance to a cooler one but never in the opposite direction. By taking advantage of this natural law it was possible to tell what a refrigeration plant would do before construction was commenced. The heat to be removed was measured in tons of refrigeration.

The refrigeration cycle, the speaker explained, was the opposite to the steam cycle. A candidate at an oral examination once replied to a question as to what steam was, "Steam is water gone crazy with the heat," he said. "Ice is water gone crazy with the cold."

Mr. Boddie explained how it was that, through the difficulties of maintaining a steady supply of ice in summer, engineers had manufactured the household refrigerators, thus doing away with the necessity of keeping the ice box full.

Refrigeration was used extensively in the making of dynamite, in the making of beer, in conditioning the air in large public buildings, in the manufacture of tennis balls and the speaker told also of a frog farm where refrigeration had been used to keep the supply equal at all times to the demand.

Seeing that refrigeration was just the reverse process to that used in the steam locomotive, Mr. Boddie explained the steam engine process. He showed why ammonia was a good refrigerant to use and also carbon-dioxide. Refrigerators had four main parts, the liquid receiver, the compressor, the condenser and evaporator. With these properly connected and with a suitable power to drive the compressor the plant was ready for business.
