New Trade Agreement Between Britain and Russia Signed Today

Pact Contains Specific Provision to Meet Possible Price Cutting Tactics Such as Canada Had Complained Of in Respect to Timber

LONDON, Feb. 16: (CP)-Safeguard against any interference with benefits of British Empire preferences was contained in a new trade agreement between Great Britain and Soviet Russia which was signed today. The pact contains a specific provision to meet possible price cutting tactics which, in the case of Soviet timber especially, had aroused sharp Canadian objection.
