### WHIFFLETS

From the Waterfront

With 219 passengers, including 193 round-trip tourists, on board, C. P. R. steamer Princess Charlotte, Capt. W. Q. Pamer, was in port from 3:45 to 5:30 Saturday afternoon southbound from Skagway to Vancouver. One passenger disembarked from the vessel here while four boarded her at this port for the south.

The B. C. Packers service boat Florida V. arrived in port last night from Vancouver to pick up C. Thomas, managing director of the company, who flew north from Vancouver late last week owing to the cold storage plant fire at Claxton. Mr. Thomas will return south on the Florida V. after visiting other company plants in the north. Mrs. Thomas arrived on the Princess Louise this morning from Vancouver and went aboard the Florida V. here.

Over four hundred tourists were in town this morning aboard two Alaska steamers. C. N. R. Prince George, Capt. H. E. Nedden, arriving at 9 a.m. from Skagway and sailing at 3 p.m. for Vancouver, had 205 passengers on board, sixteen of whom disembarked here. C. P. R. steamer Princess Louise, Capt. Thomas Cliff, arriving at 10 a.m. from Vancouver and sailing at noon for Alaska, had 203 passengers on board including 144 round-trippers. The Louise also had 440 tons of freight for Skagway.

The Armour Salvage Co.'s service boat Salvage Princess, Capt. Joe Desmules, which happened to be in port over the week-end from New Massett where she is under packing charter to the Nootka Packing Co.'s cannery, was pressed into service Saturday night to bring to the plant of the Canadian Fish & Cold Storage Co. here some 150,000 pounds of frozen halibut and salmon which had been salvaged from the Edmunds & Walker cold storage plant at Claxton on the Skeena River which was destroyed by fire last Friday. The Salvage Princess brought the fish in in her hold and on three scows Sunday morning and left last night for down the coast with A. Ferguson, manager of the Massett cannery.

Success followed the footsteps of the ambitious young actress. It was during these successful days that she bridged the formerly uncrossable chasm between the social "Four Hundred" and the theatrical world. She became acquainted with Mrs. Stuyvesant Fish, leader in New York society, while appearing as an entertainer at her home, and the acquaintanceship developed into a lasting friendship.

Not only social leaders were among her friends. She was a friend of most of the famous men and women in politics, finance and the arts over the world. She knew all the presidents since Cleveland.
