Dr. Kurt Schuschnigg Succeeds Engelbert Dolfuss as Chancellor-Disgruntled Nazi Soldier Confesses Having Committed Assassination

LONDON, July 30: (CP)-Rt. Hon. Stanley Baldwin, acting Prime Minister of Great Britain, informed Parliament today that there is no immediate danger of war in Europe despite the difficulties and perplexities of the present situation. Later Sir John Simon, Foreign Secretary, reiterated that Great Britain has no present intention of

intervening to preserve Austrian independence. Reports from Austria indicate that the smoke of civil ACTRESS war there is lifting and that a new war has been averted by the victory of Austrian government forces against the Nazis.

VIENNA, July 30: (CP)-A new Austrian cabinet was appointed yesterday with Dr. Kurt Schuschnigg, an ardent anti-Nazi, succeeding Engelbert Dolfuss as Chancellor, Prince Ernst von Starhemberg was renamed vice-chancellor.

Authorities today announced that Otto Planetta, disgruntled former Army sergeant, dismissed because of Nazi sympathies, confessed to firing the shot last Wednesday which killed Chancellor Dolfuss.
