TRIBUTE TO MME. CURIE

Was Discoverer of Radium and a Great Benefactor to Mankind—Followed Traditions of Science

BALLANCHES, France, July 19, (CP)—Madame Marie Curie, aged 66, co-discoverer with her husband, the late Pierre Curie, of radium, who died here recently following many weeks of treatment for an anaemic condition, throughout her life preserved the best traditions of science.

Fame came to her threshold, but she shut the door of her workshop in its face; wealth was hers for the asking, but she turned all money prizes back into her chemistry or gave them to hospitals for cancer research; luxury might have been her lot without reproach, but she spurned it and lived frugally on her modest salary as a teacher in the University of Paris.

She consented to take but a mite of the huge debt owed by the world for the Curie gift to mankind in 1898 of the substance which enriched many persons and brought relief or cure to countless thousands of cancer sufferers.

Twice she was a winner of the Nobel prize for chemistry, the first time in 1903 as a partner in the reward with her husband; the second time in her widowhood in 1911. Both awards went back into the research work.

The medical world has estimated that radium saved 50,000 wounded men from death in the world war. Its use in the treatment of cancer was suggested in 1910 and physicians have employed it with increasing success, especially on external growths that have not developed to a critical stage.

Mme. Curie spent more than 20 years of her life in the research that ended with discovery and isolation of this substance.

She was born Marie Sklodowska in Warsaw, Poland, November 7, 1867. Her father was professor of mathematics and physics in the University of Warsaw and her mother directed a school for girls. Growing up in this academic atmosphere, she early determined to qualify as a teacher. Study occupied all her waking moments.

In 1896 she married Pierre Curie, a young French scientist, but managed to keep house, continue her studies and teach a class of girls. The cares of motherhood were added to this program in 1897. Still she continued pursuit of her doctorate and it was while working on

her thesis in the following year that investigation of pitchblende revealed two new substances—polonium and radium.

In 1906 came tragedy, M. Curie being run down and killed by a truck on a Paris street. After this his widow lived practically cut off from human companionship except for her daughters. The elder became her mother's chief assistant in the laboratory. The younger is a pianiste of some renown and has given several recitals in France.
