WATERFRONT WHIFFS

Announcement of Interest Regarding New Medicine —New Halibut Fishing Regulations Expected To be Announced Soon

As announced earlier this week, a company of local people has become interested in a plan to establish a plant at Prince Rupert for the manufacture of "thalatol," a newly discovered vitamin-containing medicinal product, made from the oils of halibut, greyfish and pilchard livers, which has been found to be equal, if not superior, in quality to the best cod liver oil. Further, it can be produced commercially at a comparative cost from livers of fishes which in the past have not been considered to be worth treating. Chemical and bio-chemical departments of the Prince Rupert Fisheries Experimental Station have developed two new processes for the extraction of the vitamin-containing oils from these fishes. The sequel to these discoveries has been the interesting of the Prince Rupert group in the possibilities of commercial manufacture. "Thalatol" is the new name that has been chosen for this new medicinal product which was at first designated "marinol," it being subsequently found, however, that this name is already in use. Tests made last year among Prince Rupert school children of "thalatol" established its medicinal properties and value. These tests are being followed up again this year.

"Thalatol" is but one of two newly announced discoveries of importance which have just recently been made as a result of research work at the Prince Rupert Fisheries Experimental Station. The other discovery is that of a new and more economical process for the glazing of fish. This new glaze can be applied to the ice cold fish without having to dip the fish in warm water as has been done in the past. The process produces an attractive translucent effect and also acts as a chemical preservative of the fish. The process has been adopted by the Canadian Fish & Cold Storage Co. which has received favorable reports upon it from the trade.

The provincial government has issued a herring reduction plant licence to Nelson Bros' Fisheries Limited of Vancouver for the reduction plant at Tucks Inlet, Prince Rupert, which, it is expected, will be operated again early next year after having been closed down for several months.

Halibut fishing interests at Prince Rupert are awaiting with interest the announcement of new regulations governing the fishery for the year 1935 which it is expected will be made in the near future. At a recent conference in Seattle with various branches of the industry, proposed new regulations were discussed by the International Fisheries Commission. It is expected there may be some rather important changes next year.
