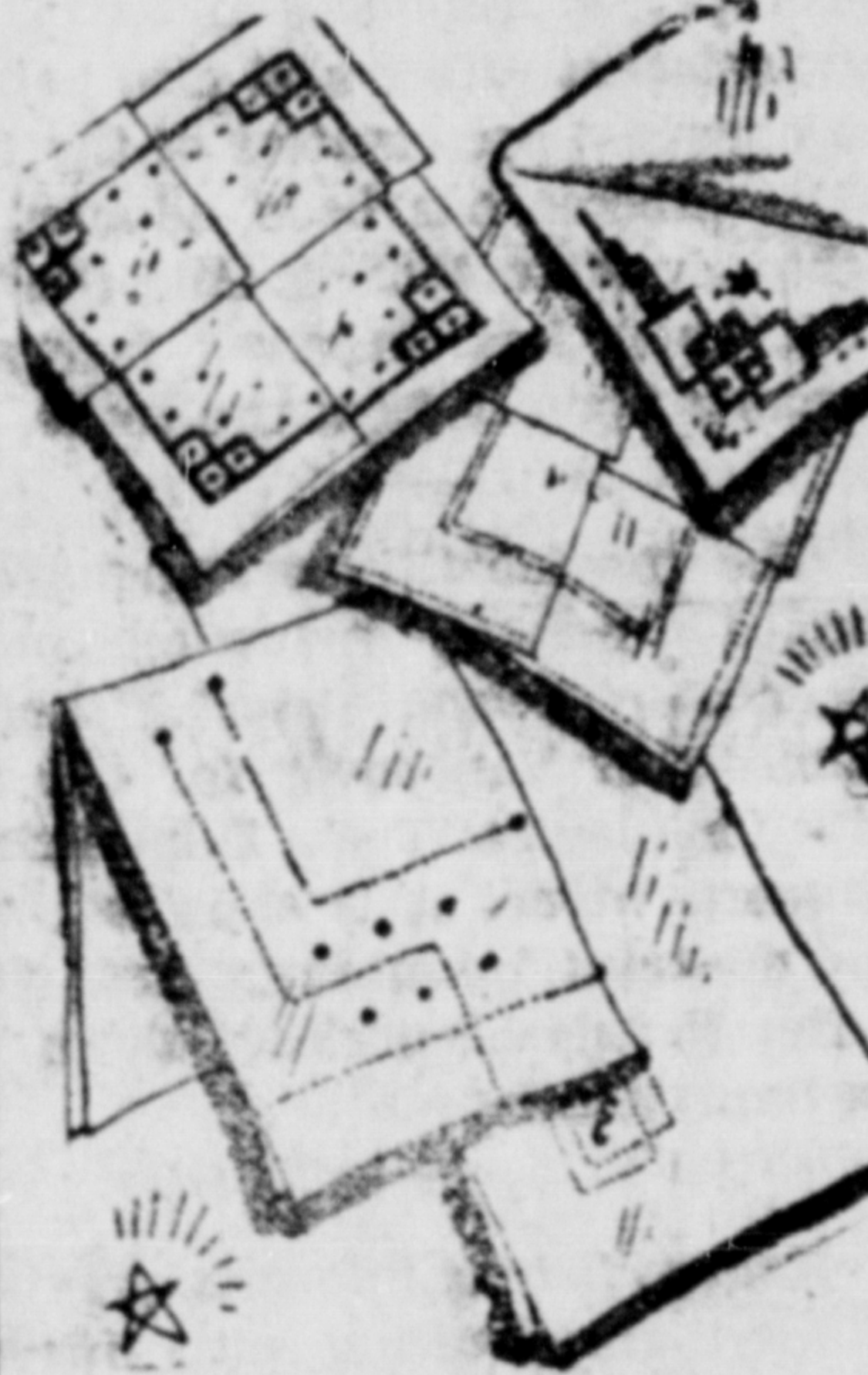
### One Hundred Attend Labor League Dance
