FLAKED COD

Delicacy with Cream and Curry Powder Cold fish carefully flaked, make a mixture of cream, curry powder, salt and butter; have some boiled rice dry and whole, cook the fish slowly in the curry mixture, and add the hot rice, tossing all well together; when hot, dish the kedgeryn in a pyramid (should be a pretty gold color), and grate over the top some of the yolk of hard-boiled egg, cut the whites in rings and garnish with these and some fried parsley.

Ever Taste Flower Sandwiches?

You make them with fragrant butter, and press them together or roll the slices. They are attractive with a petal or two of the flowers strewn on the butter so that it will just show at the edge. Wrap the sandwiches in muslin and put them in a bowl with flowers until wanted. When handed round, lay a spray of flowers on the plate. Nasturtiums are often the flower chosen to flavor the butter with.

PHOTOGRAPHY FOR GIRLS

Pleasant and Profitable Hobby Nowadays A college girl during this summer earned money to finish her course by making post cards on which were views of a noted summer resort. The most beautiful collection of photographs the writer has seen were made by a lady who followed the pursuit for her own pleasure.

Many English women are engaged in photography and are very successful. Pre-eminence among these is Miss Alice Hughes, who began the work when it was looked upon as scarcely suited to women. We are told that Miss Hughes has probably taken more photographs of royal personages and their children than any other living photographer, and she has received at different times many marks of royal favor.

Until the accession of King Edward and Queen Alexandra, Miss Hughes made a point of never going out of her studio to take photographs—her sitters, even the most distinguished of them—came to her. But after that event she went several times to Buckingham palace to take portraits of Queen Alexandra; and one of her most prized treasures is a beautiful monogram brooch, set with precious stones, which was presented to her by the Queen Mother after one of these sittings.

Miss Hughes is a daughter of the late Mr. Edward Hughes, the portrait painter whose pictures of beautiful women are well known. Most of the noted and lovely women of the day have sat to him. He painted Queen Mary when she was still Duchess of York, and he had the honor of painting Queen Alexandra no less than three times. The work gives an opportunity for the development of the skill and artistic taste which is characteristic of a great many women.

OFF THE PLATE Socks Seybold holds the American League record for home runs. He established it in 1902. The former Athletic, who is now playing ball in the American Association, in that year made sixteen. Luderus is confident that he will be able to surpass this record.

Alexander of the Phillies, says that the big league scouts, as a rule evade the New York State League in looking for players. It can be safely said that in the future the scouts will change their routes.

President Ben Johnson of the American League, is different from Tom Lynch in punishing ball players. Instead of suspending the athletes and thereby weakening the club he imposes a big fine. Lynch would rather suspend a player for three days or more, as he did Joe Tinker, in Brooklyn. It was Tinker's first offense in four years.

When the Sanford horses were shipped away from Amsterdam, N. Y., to the sales ring at Buffalo last week, not a wheel was turned in the great carpet mills of Amsterdam. Jimmy Britt is the latest arrival. He announces that he has secured a lease on the Huber casino, and will put on only top notchers. Meanwhile sentiment against the game is growing, and an effort is to be made by the reform element to have the law repealed when the Legislature reconvenes.
