Board on the three and half miles of road running from the wharf out past Seal Cove. He explained that he wanted to get the Board's approval so that the subsidy from the Dominion Government could be obtained.

The Commissioners again argued that the company had broken the law and, said the Chairman, "As far as I am concerned you will not get what you want."

**Infringed People's Rights**

"We are not asking for more than our rights," stated Mr. Tate. "Yes, you are, you blazed away on this piece of road ignoring the Railway Act," said Judge Mabec.

"No rights infringed," began Mr. Tate.

"Yes, you did, you infringed Mr. Rochester's and perhaps others too. The Province gave these men access to the bay from the waterfront and put in a dock and then you go and build this embankment and build a track and slip in here with this telegram to say that you have a title," said the Chairman.

Mr. Tate filed his application but did not obtain what he wanted.

**SAYS "GHOSTS IN RUPERT STORES"**

**Rev. Dr. E. A. Chown Methodist General Superintendent for the West Warns Against Commercialism Last Night.**

"As a boy I used to dread passing a certain churchyard," said Rev. Dr. Chown preaching last night in the Methodist Church. They are the spirits of men who are lost to the spirit of Christianity, buried in the hard material world, anxious only for gain, merciless to competitors in the struggle for life of the commercial world."

**STEEL BOAT "HANS B" IN**

**Delayed for a Few Hours Before Berthing by Quarantine Regulations—Brings 6800 Tons Steel for G. T. P.**

With six thousand eight hundred tons of steel for the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway construction work, the steamer "Hans B." arrived at about seven o'clock last night from Sydney, Cape Breton, by way of the Straits of Magellan. The boat made a good trip the voyage being for the most part uneventful. Longshoremen have been on the qui vive for this steamer's arrival since she was spoken off San Francisco a few days ago. The Hans B. was delayed a matter of twelve hours or so on her arrival in port by the quarantine regulations. Anchored out in the harbor this morning on the approach of the Prince George from Stewart in the thick morning mist she kept the city on the jump with her siren answered unstintingly by of Prince Rupert's getting the new title of "Siren City" with her characteristic weather morning mists followed by glorious sunshine.
