**Halibut Landings
This July Lower**

Catch For Month Ending Today is
1,796,000 Pounds as Against
2,015,000 Last Year

Halibut landings at the port of Prince Rupert for the month of July this year totalled 1,796,000 pounds as compared with 2,015,000 pounds in the same month last year. The Canadian catch for the month was 868,000 pounds as compared with 965,000 pounds in July 1933 while the American catch for the month ending today was 928,000 pounds in comparison with 1,050,000 pounds last year.
