### Bright Meteor Seen Last Night

Just about twenty minutes past eight last night an exceptionally brilliant meteor shot across the eastern sky in a northeasterly direction. Though the setting sun was still strongly illuminating the whole western sky and every object could be distinctly seen over the landscape the meteor shone out more brilliant than the brightest star at midnight, and sent a trail of light like a rocket as it sped out of sight behind the bush across Shawatlas Passage. No other star was visible at the time, and the meteor must have been particularly near to the earth. Lately quite a number of more distant shooting stars have been apparent after dark, but this one was in bright twilight and must have been a larger mass of incandescent matter than usual.
