"As far as the halibut are concerned it does not make any difference to the race whether you catch them in the summer or in the winter but it is certainly a step in the right direction that cannot do any possible harm and may, as some advocates insist, be of material benefit to the future of the fishing" stated J. P. Babcock, assistant provincial commissioner of fisheries, who is in the city on a regular tour of inspection, in reply to a query by The News.
