HIGH EDUCATION RURAL SCHOOLS

Saskatchewan to Provide Facilities for High School Work in Country Schools.

REGINA, Jan. 21.—The Saskatchewan assembly is debating the question of providing additional facilities for secondary education, and facilities for children in the rural sections of the province.

It is proposed that rural schools shall undertake high school work and a bill will be introduced providing for relief in district areas by means of bank loans.

SULTAN IS HOPEFUL ABOUT PEACE TREATY

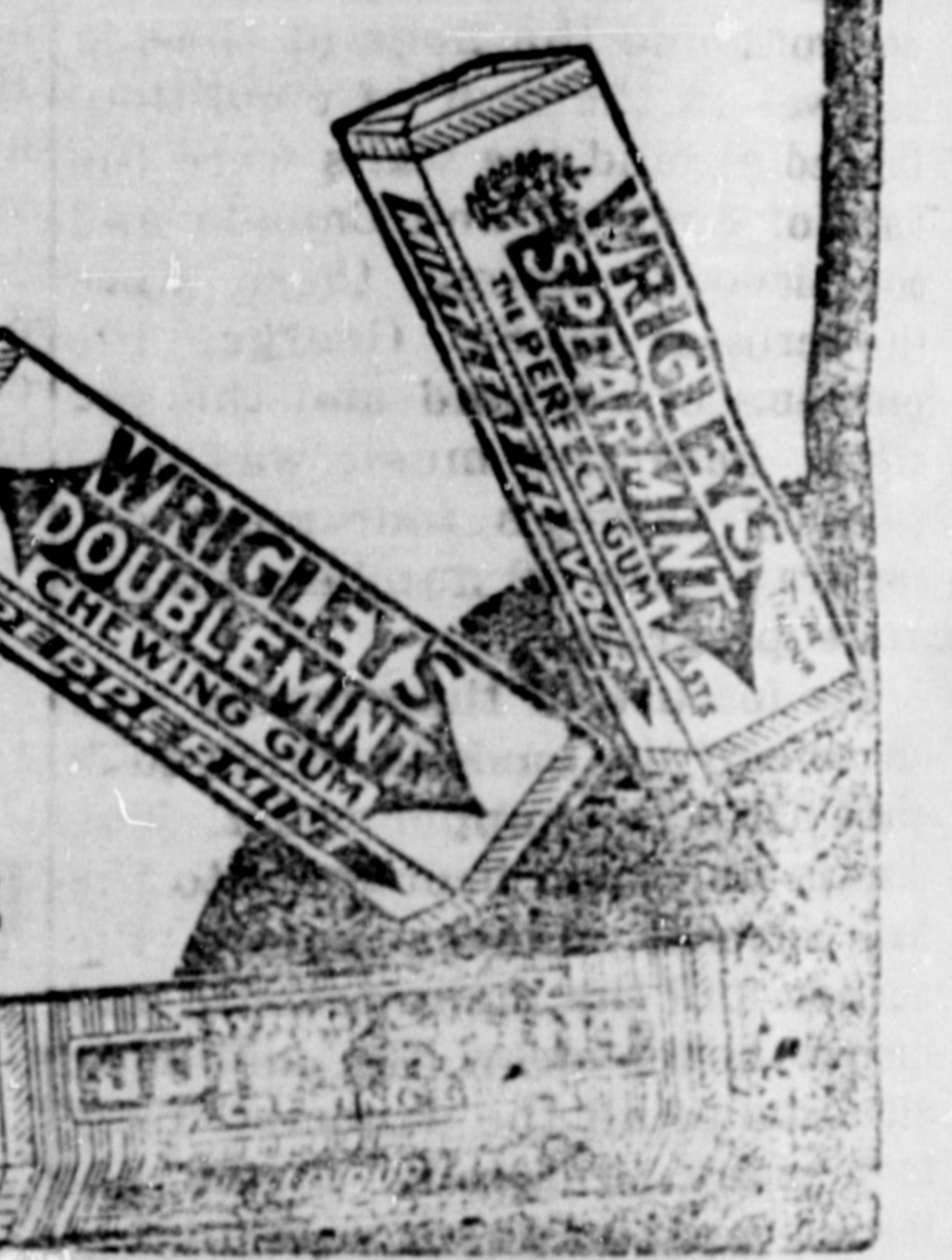
