C. N. R. steamer Prince Rupert, having completed her annual overhaul, a job which has been in progress for several weeks at the local dry dock, moved down to the Canadian National dock this morning and, in command of Capt. H. E. Neidden, will sail tonight for Vancouver via Ocean Falls and Powell River, taking over the run from the steamer Prince George. Capt. Edward Mabbs, which will retire from service for overhaul here following her arrival this evening from Anjox and Stewart.

Harry A. Johnson of Seattle, whose tender for purchase of hall-but livers this year was recently accepted by the American halibut boat owners, arrived in the city yesterday from the south, being here on business. The local vessel owners and fishermen have not as yet definitely signed up for the disposal of their halibut livers.

With nine carloads of mild cured salmon, five carloads of frozen halibut and one carload of canned salmon for transshipment east over Canadian National Railways, Northland Transportation Co.'s motorship liner Northland, Capt. Len Williams, arrived in port last night from Ketchikan and, after discharging, sailed in continuation of her voyage to Seattle. The fish brought in by the Northland is being dispatched east by extra train today.
