GEORGE, Utah, March 7: (CP)—Ten persons were killed and a dozen others seriously injured late last night when a large charge of nitro-glycerine prematurely exploded as a crowd gathered to watch the spectacular "shooting" of the first oil well in this district. The explosive charge, dropped into the unfinished well, exploded
