#### Silk Gowns Grow More Fashionable Than Ever

Silk gowns are becoming more fashionable all the time, and while it will be a difficult matter to do away with satin, these soft finished silks are very charming and can be draped and made up to have many of the admirable qualities of satin. Changeable effects and colors and the queer old fashioned shot silk designs are all in the fashion are used for both afternoon and evening gowns. Filet lace of the finest quality and embroidered filet net are popular trimmings for silk, and also for satin gowns, and the sheer mesh of the net shows the beauty of the coloring of the silk or satin to great advantage.

A most fascinating model that can be made in silk or satin shows this combination of silk and filet in the trimming on the front of the gown. The stain is slashed at the side, showing a panel or almost an entire skirt, of the filet and is then draped up under a folded fichu of the satin. This is not an easy model to copy, and in fact, requires the skill of an expert to have the folds so arranged that they will give artistic lines.

Suede shoes with tiny straps over the instep are very popular. Black patent leather shoes with white tops are worn with tailored suits.

The addition of black velvet is one of the features this summer that is not exactly cool, but it's stylish and the Parisian designs are emphasizing the touch of black velvet in all departments of dress.
