IS AFTER BUILDING

Olof Hanson Continues Fight For Federal Work Here—Asks For Geological Survey in North

Olof Hanson, M. P. for Skeena, inquired a few days ago in the House of Commons at Ottawa from Hon. H. A. Stewart, minister of public works, as to the possibility of consideration being given under the supplementary estimates or under the \$40,000,000 building scheme of 1934 to a new federal building in Prince Rupert.

Little satisfaction, however, was given by Mr. Stewart who stated that he did not know whether there would be any supplementaries this year and that, as far as the act of 1934 was concerned, most of the items were specifically set out and that any construction such as that proposed would be entirely outside the provisions of that act and would have to be provided for by a separate item either in another bill or in the estimates.

Mr. Hanson replied that he had found that approximately half of the vote in the act of 1934 had not been ear-marked for anything. He asked the minister to give further consideration to the matter of the Prince Rupert building, for which a site had been acquired and the excavation completed, and reserved the right to discuss the question further.

Geological Survey During consideration of a Geological Survey estimate in the House, Mr. Hanson asked Hon. W. A. Gordon, minister of mines, what proportion of a vote of \$190,000 for field work this year was to be expended in British Columbia and where work in this province was to be done.

Mr. Gordon replied that work was

to be done in several parts of British Columbia but mentioned nothing for the northern section of the province.

Mr. Hanson pointed out that representations had been made to the department from the Unuk River area, the Bulkley and Nechako area and the Bella Coola area.

The minister had nothing definite to say in regard to these areas.

"Murder on the Diamond" and "Here Comes the Groom" on Capitol Screen

"Death on the Diamond," a vivid murder mystery with an unusual plot, and "Here Comes the Groom," a new comedy replete with good, clean, hearty laughter, comprise an interesting double bill picture program on the screen of the Capitol Theatre here this mid-week.
