

The message suggested that a search plane, which was to have gone north to look for the couple, be instructed not to proceed.

Provincial Constable J. V. Boys, who is conducting a search, will also be withdrawn as soon as he can be contacted.

The scarch plane had not reached Prince Rupert up to today. It is an American machine piloted by L. F. Barr and has been operating out of Telegraph Creek. Whether or not it was instrumental in finding the couple is not yet known.
