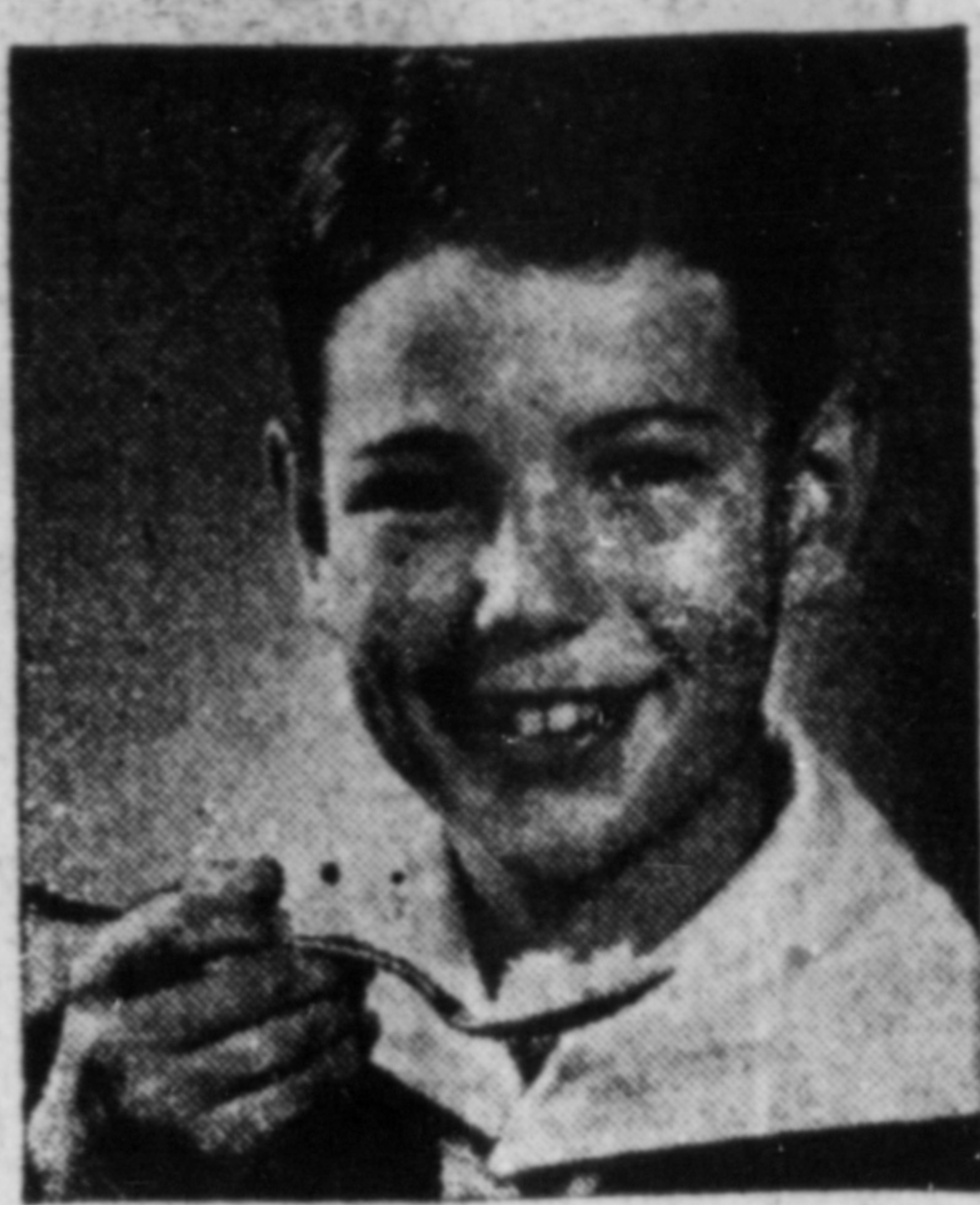

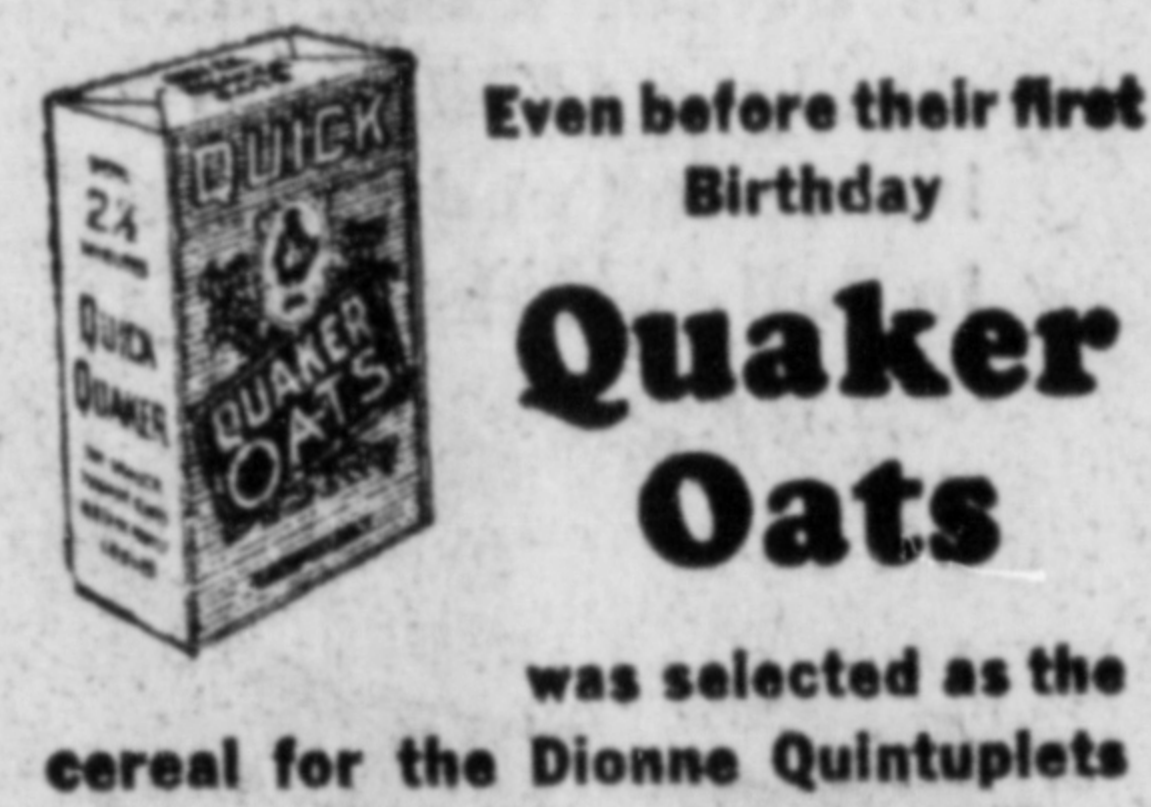

Mussolini with a view to having him end his invasion of Ethiopia will be discussed at Geneva today, high British sources report.

United States Attitude WASHINGTON, D.C., Oct. 31:—Backing up another appeal which had been made earlier in the day by Secretary of State Cordell Hull to arms manufacturers of the United States against supplying of guns or munitions to either of the belligerents in the Italo-Ethiopian conflict, President Franklin D. Roosevelt last night issued a statement stating that it was the policy of the government not only to keep this country out of any war but to refrain from doing anything that would tend to prolong war between any other countries of the world.

Representations to Duce LONDON, Oct. 31: (CP)—Great Britain today made new representations to Premier Benito Mussolini against continuation of attacks upon this country by the Italian press. At the same time the government warned against extension of credit for goods purchased by Italy. The Board of Trade estimates that more than two million pounds sterling is outstanding for goods already supplied.

NEW YORK, Oct. 31: (CP)—At the 14th annual Woman's Exposition of Arts and Industries held here recently cookery contests competed for attention with lectures on economical buying and fashion shows with the United States merchant marine.

The clubwomen turned their attention on one day from economics to cookies, especially pumpkin pie and devil's food cake. It was Northern States Day in the contest, and these were the dishes which the committee had decreed were characteristic of the section.

Southern cooks showed sponge cake, pecan pie and corn bread. A \$50,000 collection of hooked rugs, displayed by Mrs. Caroline E. Saunders, of Clinton, Mass., occupied one of the booths. The central exhibit was a flight of stairs each step and tread covered by a tiny rug, representing one episode in a woman's life.

From North Bennington, came a collection of maple hand-fashioned furniture, pieces of which were alike, which old cobblers' benches, farrier's traps were adopted in modern use.

Changes to Come In Medical Field

Alberta Professor Declares State Control. Great Strides Predicted In Next Ten Years

SASKATOON, Sask., Oct. 31: (CP)—Lack of government is the main drawback in state medicine proposals, but within the next ten years tremendous changes in the practice of medicine will be made, declares Dean W. S. Lindsay of the University of Saskatchewan medical school in an address here. Successful forms of the government system already in operation are free clinics for cancer and venereal diseases, as well as institutions for the treatment of tuberculosis, said Dr. Lindsay,

and with state control taking a major part in medical research standards will be raised to new levels.

"That well beloved character, the general practitioner, is slowly becoming a thing of the past," he stated. Under state control opportunities to students of medicine would be greatly enlarged for areas unable at present to obtain medical services because of lack of funds would be supplied with professional aid by the government.

He cited the "panel" system of Great Britain as a decided boon to the public and medical men.

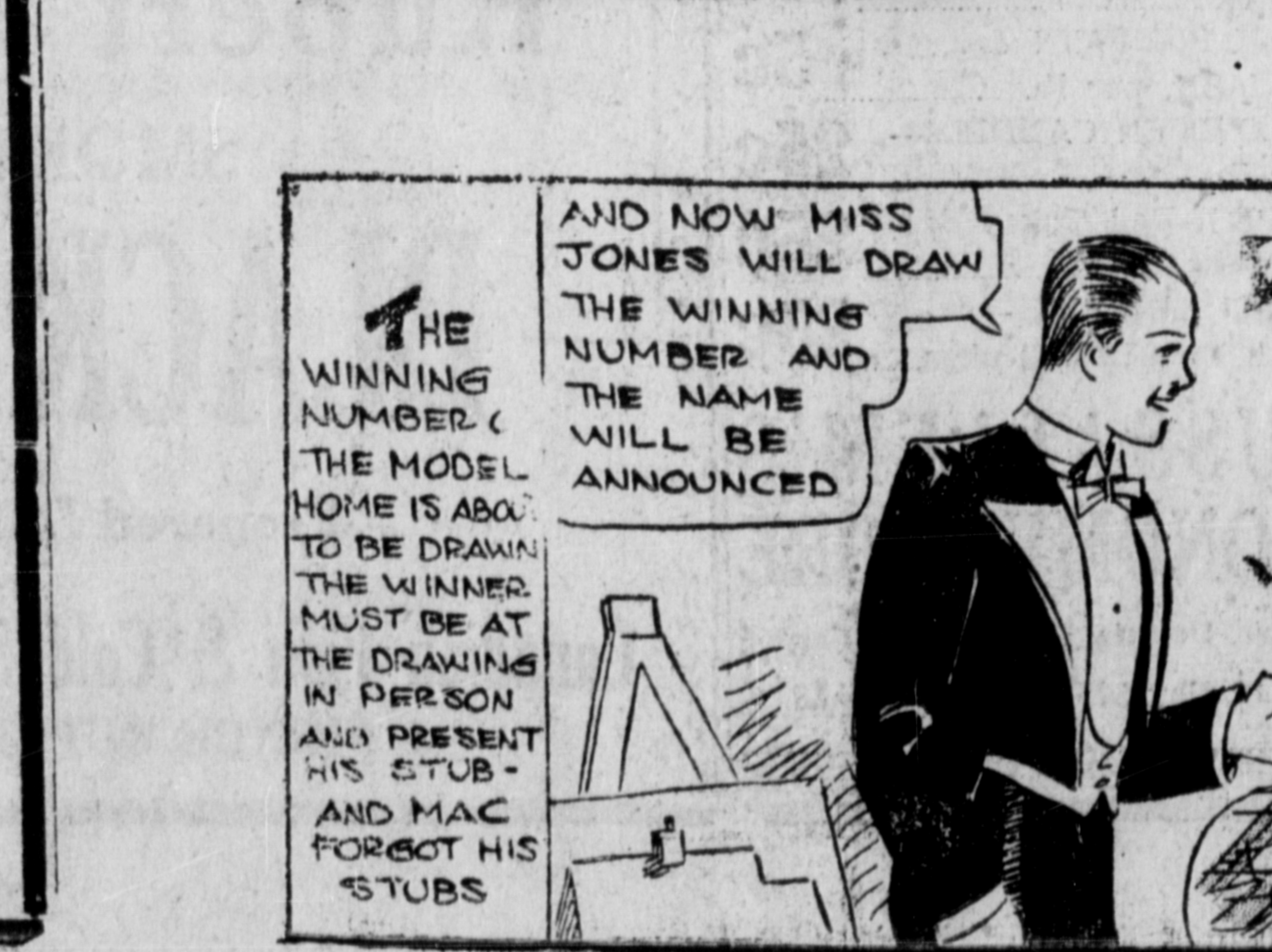
