DISAGREEMENT OVER TREATMENT OF ITALY IS MORE SERIOUS AND TWO POWERS MAY CLASH SHORTLY.

The Italians continue to bomb Ethiopian points.

Government officials in Italian Somaliland deny reports that a fleet of twenty bombing airplanes killed many women and children in Ethiopian villages or that Italian planes have been brought down by Ethiopia aircraft guns.

All the region in the vicinity of Aduwa has now been formally claimed in the name of King Victor Emmanuel of Italy.

A counter attack by Ethiopia on the northern front is expected next week and preparations are also being made for more intensive fighting on the southern front. Mean-time heavy casualties are reported in fighting on both sides although the Ethiopians appear to be holding their own at the most of points. Arms and ammunition are reported to be entering Ethiopia via British Somaliland.

Giuseppe Bottai, governor of Rome and one of the founders of the Fascist party, has been designated a bomber for a plane piloted by Count Ciano, Premier Mussolini's son-in-law.

Ethiopia Resolute
ADDIS ABABA, Oct. 16.—Emperor Haile Selassie said yesterday that he was prepared to enter into peace overtures with Italy but he would not surrender Ethiopia's sovereignty nor would he give up any territory.

Calling More Troops
ROME, Oct. 16.—All men of the age of 32 and 55 who had previously been rejected as unfit to fight are to be re-examined by the army medical corps with a view to pressing them into military service, it was announced yesterday.

Roumania Is Worried
BUCHAREST, Roumania, Oct. 16.—Grave concern for the loss of Italian trade through Roumania's participation in League of Nations sanctions against Italy is being expressed in economic circles here.

Katharine Hepburn Drama And Novel Western on Mid-Week Program at Capitol



A nagging, disillusioned, but still ambitious mother is portrayed by Ann Shoemaker. The shiftless, cynical young brother is handled by Frank Albertson. The handsome lover is played by Fred MacMurray. Evelyn Venable plays Miss Hepburn's society girl rival.

A story with the gripping interest of a Sherlock Holmes mystery and the scenic beauty and action of the west is "Rocky Mountain Mystery." The action of the film is laid in an abandoned western mining town where two murders occur. In a dramatic and gripping final climax Scott reveals the criminal.
