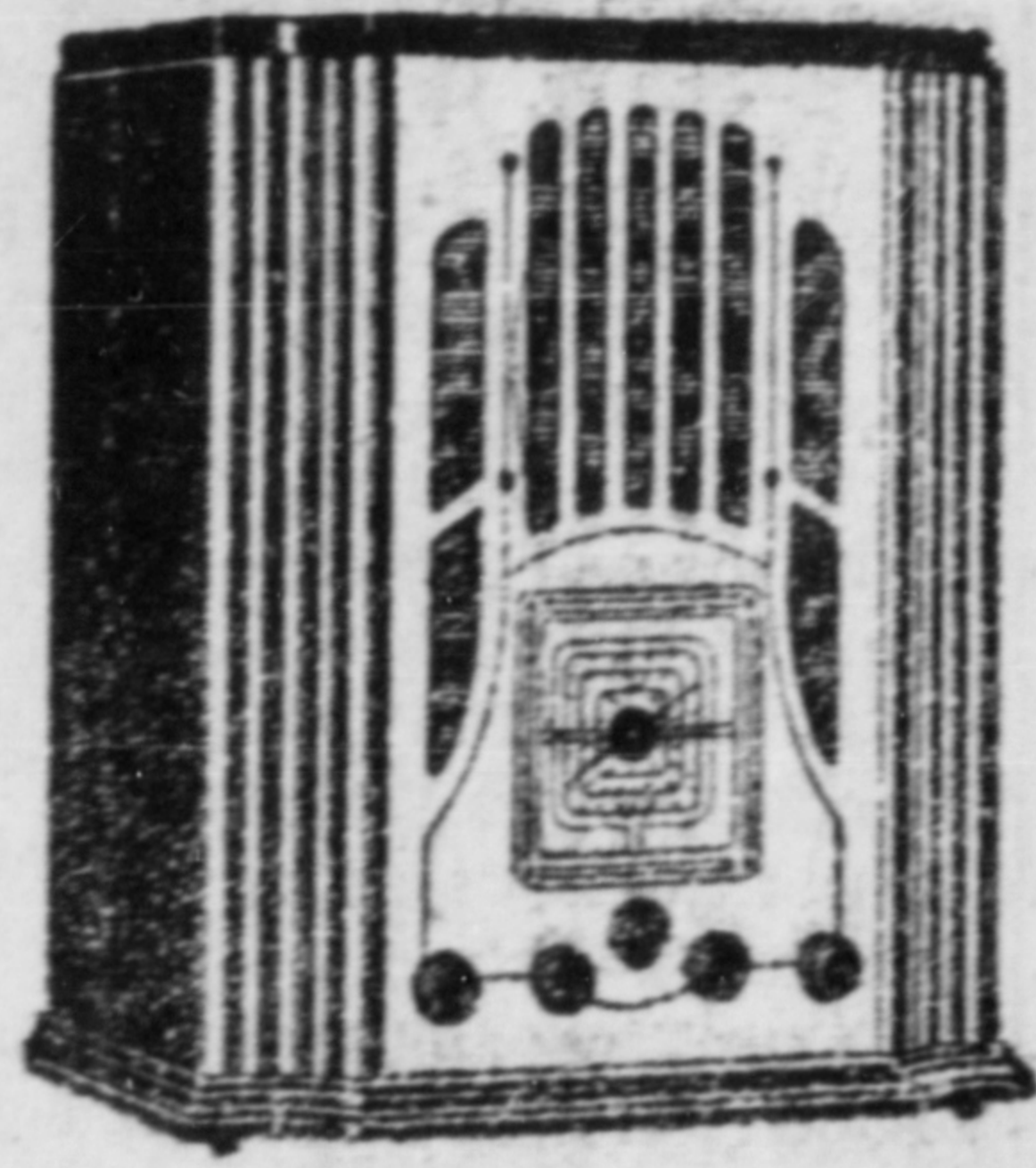


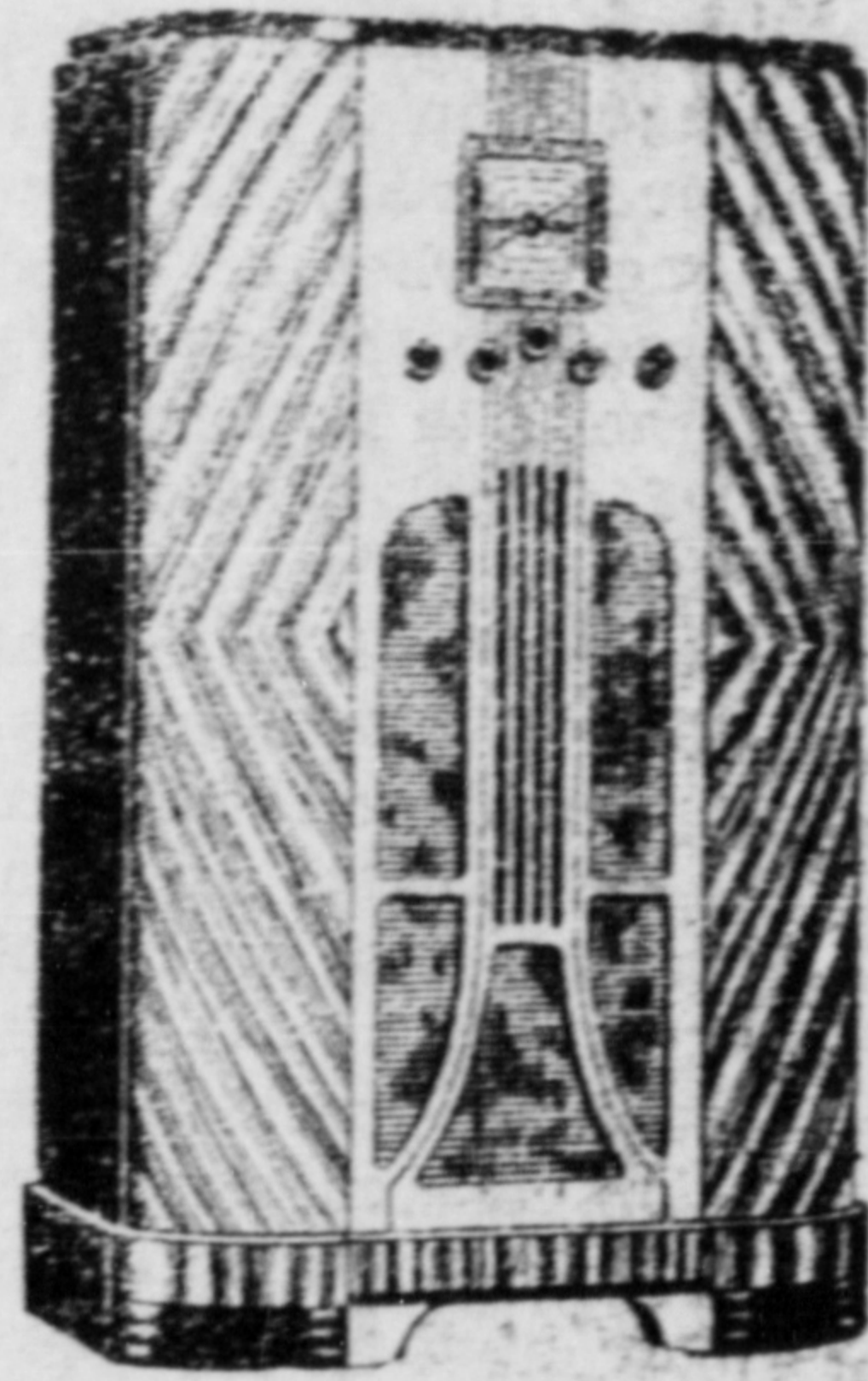

DR. MANDY'S LONG TRIP

Resident Mining Engineer Back In Prince Rupert After Spending Four Months in Field

Saw Much Ground

Visited Atlin, Cassiar, Unuk River And Portland Canal District Since Leaving June 1

After an absence from the city of over four months, Dr. Joseph T. Mandy, resident mining engineer for the northwestern mineral survey district, is home, accompanied by Mrs. Mandy, arriving on the Catala this morning from Stewart. He left Prince Rupert on June 1 and has since made an intensive examination of mining properties in the Atlin, Cassiar, Unuk River and Portland Canal districts. He will now be busy at his office here compiling the information and data gathered on his tour for inclusion in the next annual report of the Department of Mines.

Dr. Mandy's first visit in the course of his long trip was to the Atlin district where he reports there is considerable activity, both in placer and lode gold mining. Approximately 200 men have been employed this season on the creeks in the Atlin district, the majority being on Spruce Creek. The Columbia Development Co. has two steam shovels working on Spruce Creek and has had a very successful season.

The resident engineer next visited Telegraph Creek and continued on into Dease Lake and McDames Creek. In that section there is a considerable revival in mining interest. Quite extensive prospecting for lode and placer gold is being carried out by individual prospectors with good results being obtained. Quartz Creek, a tributary of McDames, is the scene of the greatest amount of development.

Flying from Ketchikan to Burroughs Bay and then crossing the Alaskan Panhandle into Canadian territory, Dr. Mandy spent three weeks in the Unuk River district. His investigations on the Unuk this year covered a distance of twenty miles up from the international boundary and all tributary streams. Bruce Johnson's placer property was checked up as were also his lode mining locations on McQuillan Creek. They have promising values and geological conditions are favorable. Blanton's placer locations on test have disclosed exceptionally good values and will be further tested with a Keystone drill to determine their commercial worth. Other properties were also visited on Unuk River by Dr. Mandy including those in which Premier and Prince Rupert syndicates are interested.

Dr. Mandy, after visiting the Unuk section, came around by gasboat from Ketchikan to Stewart and has been for the past three weeks visiting the many active properties in the Portland Canal section.
