# Vancouver Stocks MART IS

Fears in Regard to Gold Clause Decision Dispelled

NEW YORK, Feb. 12:-Fears in regard to the possible effects of the decision on the gold clause which is being reserved by the Supreme Court of the United States apparently beginning to dissolve, the stock market showed distinct recovery at the week-end, practically all classes of issues, particularly industrials, rails and bonds showing marked gains on the day's trading. The industrial average at closing was 102.35, up 1.35; rails, 33.20, up .95; utilities, 16.73, up .04, and bonds 96.44, up .75.


