

## RIDING IS ENORMOUS

Over One Hundred olling Divisions In Skeena At Forthcoming Federal Election

There will be just over one hundred polling divisions in widespread Skeena riding at the forthcoming federal election. The huge riding takes in about one quarter of the entire area of the province of British Columbia in the northwest corner and well over one half of the coastline of the province not taking into account Alaska Panhandle. As in campaigning, the airplane is playing a prominent part in the moving of the election machinery.
