Union steamer Cardena, Capt. REPLIES TO EDITORIAL

Presbyterian Ideas in Regard to Second Coming of Christ

Influenced by an editorial which appeared recently in the Daily News Rev. W. D. Grant Pollingworth preached a sermon last evening in First Presbyterian Church in which he stated clearly the teachings of the Presbyterian Church regarding the second coming of Christ. The editorial, which was entitled "The End of the World and Such Ideas," was according to the speaker critical in its implications of the "fundamental" church which emphasized loyalty to the teachings of Holy Scripture. While not dealing with the articles which were published as the basis of the editorial, the purpose of the sermon was to publicly refute the claim which the editorial implied that the church of today, to meet present needs, must change its message and throw out many of its old ideas. The preacher stressed the fact that the Presbyterian Church was a fundamental church but yet accepted the results of accredited scientific and scholarly research into the pages of Holy Scripture. Yet, he stated, "It would be no compliment for our ministers to be praised for those 'advanced and modern ideas' which the editor seemed to consider so commendable."

Discussing the idea of God which the editor claimed "is more and more being embraced today," a "charitable and sympathetic God, not a vengeful and a terrible one," Mr. Hollingworth stated that it was because God was just and loving and charitable and sympathetic that He was also a God who judged and punished. Such was the teaching of Jesus. The final authority on these matters was Jesus Christ and not one's own ideas.

With reference to the editor's remark that "a minister's work should be more than disseminating the 'Old Testament theories,' etc." the speaker stated that while Jesus' teaching was the most revolutionary that the world had ever known, nevertheless Jesus repeatedly recognized the authority of the Old Testament Scriptures, including much of which is in dispute today. "Without being 'modern' without any disloyalty to the teachings of Holy Scripture, the church has had in every age a message to meet the needs of the human heart." The effectiveness of the church today as in every age depended not on the abandonment of "the faith of our fathers" but on loyalty to their fundamental beliefs, especially to that idea of God portrayed in the life and teaching of Jesus.

Another Question
The second question dealt with was that of the second coming of Christ. Tracing briefly the two main theories in this connection, namely the pre-millennial and the post-millennial theories, the speaker showed that both were based on the book of Revelation which was written for a special purpose to cheer the Christians in their persecution under Imperial Rome and, consequently could not be taken as a prediction of the future. Thus much that was claimed in millennial expectation was based on grounds which had no proper existence. The emphasis on this subject in Jesus' teaching, which was the only authority, was upon the certainty of the event and not upon the time. "It is our duty to work, watch and be ready, and it is enough for us to know that, apart from the abiding spiritual presence of Christ among men, there will be a final manifestation of his supremacy. He will come again. This is his own definite
