For a year ago, with much the same outfit as is on the way over, the Canadians cleaned up, with young Lieut. P. J. Martinson of La Tuque, Quebec, very much to the forefront. In team prizes, the Canadians regained the Kolapore Cup from the Mother Country and they regained the Mackinnon Challenge Cup from Scotland. These are the two greatest of team shoots for marksmen.

In the two big aggregates, Martinson won the All-Comers outright with a magnificent total of 331 out of 340, and he tied with Major Charles Bunch, formerly R. A. F. to lead the Grand Aggregate, an even more varied test.

In the individual shoots a year! ago Canada was at the top on most occasions, to lose many prizes in tie shoot-offs. But Martinson won the bronze medal Borland of Toronto won the Prince of Wales prize, second only to the the King's Prize; Sergeant James King's; and Martinson won the Stock Exchange Challenge Cup.

And while they are determined to hold the two great team prizes. Canadians in this Silver Jubilee year are even more intent on getting Canada's seventh victory in the King's. Their last was in 1929.
