Assailant of Kingfish Is Slain; Stormy Solon Is in Grave Condition

Shooting Occurs in Corridor of State House on Sunday Night --- Machine Guns Make Quick Work

BATON ROUGE, Louisiana, September 9 (Canadian Press)—Senator Huey Long was shot and wounded in the abdomen in State House last night and his assailant, Dr. C. A. Weiss jr., a thirty-year old political opponent, was shot and killed. Representative Dave Cole said that the man fired at Long as he passed in the corridor between the House and Senate chambers.

Bodyguards immediately mowed Weiss down with machine gun fire.

Long is in hospital and, although MANY ARE his condition is grave, it is hoped he will recover. Doctors flew from New Orleans to assist in attending him. Two blood tranfusions have been administered, one last night and the other this afternoon.
