## PLANS A SUPPER PARTY AT GOVERNMENT HOUSE I OFTEN MAKE CHICKEN A LA KING\*

### \*Chicken a la King

3 cups cold chicken cut in inch discs  
3 tablespoons butter  
3/4 cup flour  
1/2 green pepper cut in shreds  
1/2 red pepper cut in shreds  
1 cup chicken broth  
1 or 2 eggs (yolks only)

1/4 pound mushrooms if desired  
Salt and pepper to taste
