#### STAKANOFF MOVEMENT

What is known in Russia as the Stakanoff Movement is a scheme introduced in the land of the Soviets by a man named Stakanoff to counteract the natural tendency under communism or socialism to slacken off work.

The newspapers of Russia have orders to feature and favor the movement and in most of the factories and in large public works it may be found in operation. Theoretically Stakanovists are those who, in connection with their work, invent or adopt methods which speed up production. In practice it usually means that the Stakanovists work faster and earn bonuses by producing more through greater activity than their fellows.

Naturally exception is taken to the movement by many Russian! workers. They have no assurance that the "norm" or normal production of each worker will not be raised through it which will eventually lead to a lower rate of pay for the same amount of work. However, the Stalin Government is very keen on it and ruthless in its application. The worker who does not fall in with the increased speed does not get much consideration. Executives are not allowed to criticize the movement but in some districts there have been riots and fierce attacks made on the Stakanovists and several people killed. The murdered men are regarded as martyrs to the cause and the system of speeding up and driving toward increased production is being encouraged and enforced by the Kremlin. Thus a class of superworkers is being developed with a view to strengthening the Soviet financially and industrially.
