

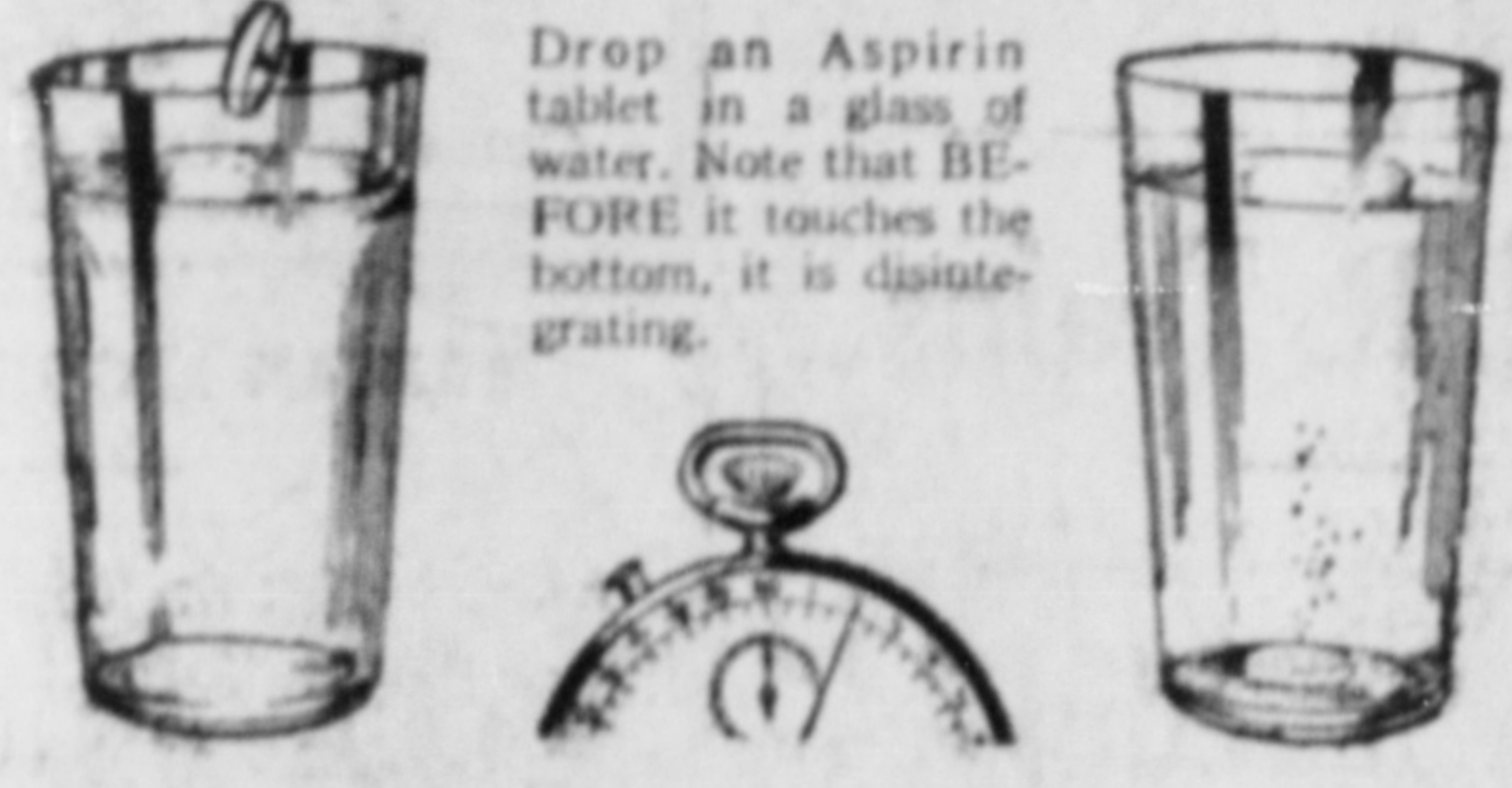

also referred to reinstatement portion of salary reductions.

A levy of tax on gifts running from two to ten percent was announced but this does not affect gifts between a husband and wife or to minors or to charitable organizations but is designed primarily to act as a deterrent to transfers of property by gift chiefly within family groups which would have the effect of reducing personal income to lower brackets than would otherwise be applicable. The two percent rate starts at \$25,000.
