CALLING TENDERS

Canadian Halibut Boat Owners and Fishermen Decide to Sell Livers Separately This Year

Prince Rupert halibut boat owners and fishermen, at a meeting last night, decided that tenders should be called separately this year for halibut livers landed by Canadian vessels. Heretofore, Canadian livers have been sold in conjunction with American but this plan has not proven satisfactory. The tenders for the Canadian livers at the dock here are to be in by Saturday and a committee consisting of Einar Larsen, George Anderson, Capt. Dan Larsen, Capt, David Ritchie, Alfred Jacobsen and Alex Duthie was appointed to deal with the tenders.

There was further discussion at last night's meeting of control of the halibut fishing during the coming season but no definite action was taken pending the outcome of negotiations with a view to having a minimum price for halibut established this season.
