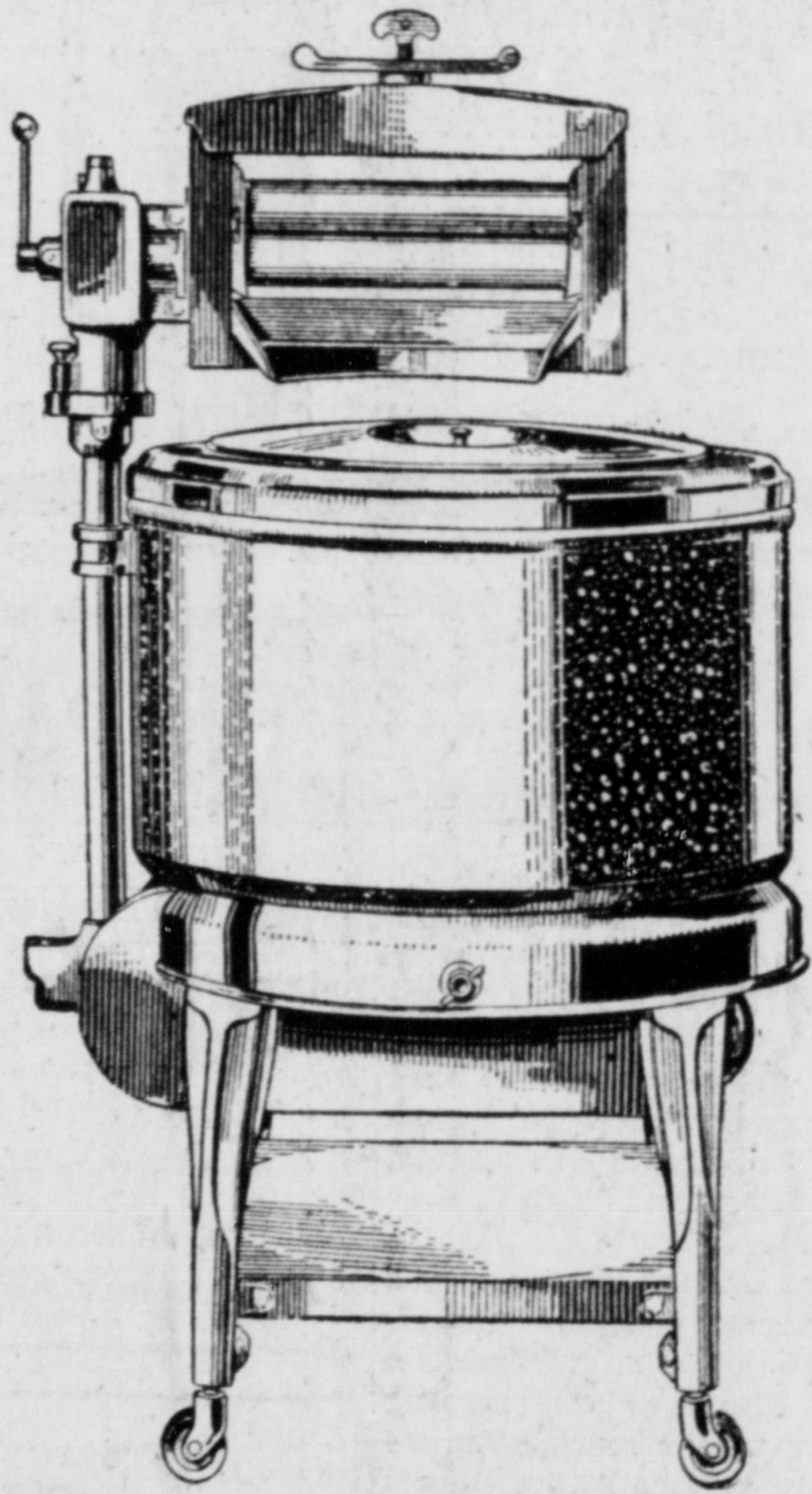

From the Waterfront

With a large list of passengers, consisting principally of round trip tourists for Alaska, C. N. R. steamer Prince Rupert, Capt. Neil McLean, arrived in port on time at 10 o'clock this morning from Vancouver, Powell River and Ocean Falls and sailed at 1 o'clock this afternoon for Skagway and other northern points whence she will return here next Monday southbound.

Coming north from Vancouver via the Queen Charlotte Islands, C. N. R. steamer Prince Charles, Capt. Dan McKinnon arrived at Massett at 10 o'clock this morning and should arrive here early tomorrow morning. The vessel has among her passengers a number of tourists who will transfer Friday to the steamer Prince George to make the trip to Anyox and Stewart and thence back to Vancouver.

## CARDINAL RICHELIEU

The supporting cast includes Edward Arnold, as the King, and Maureen O'Sullivan and Cesar Romero who have the romantic leads.

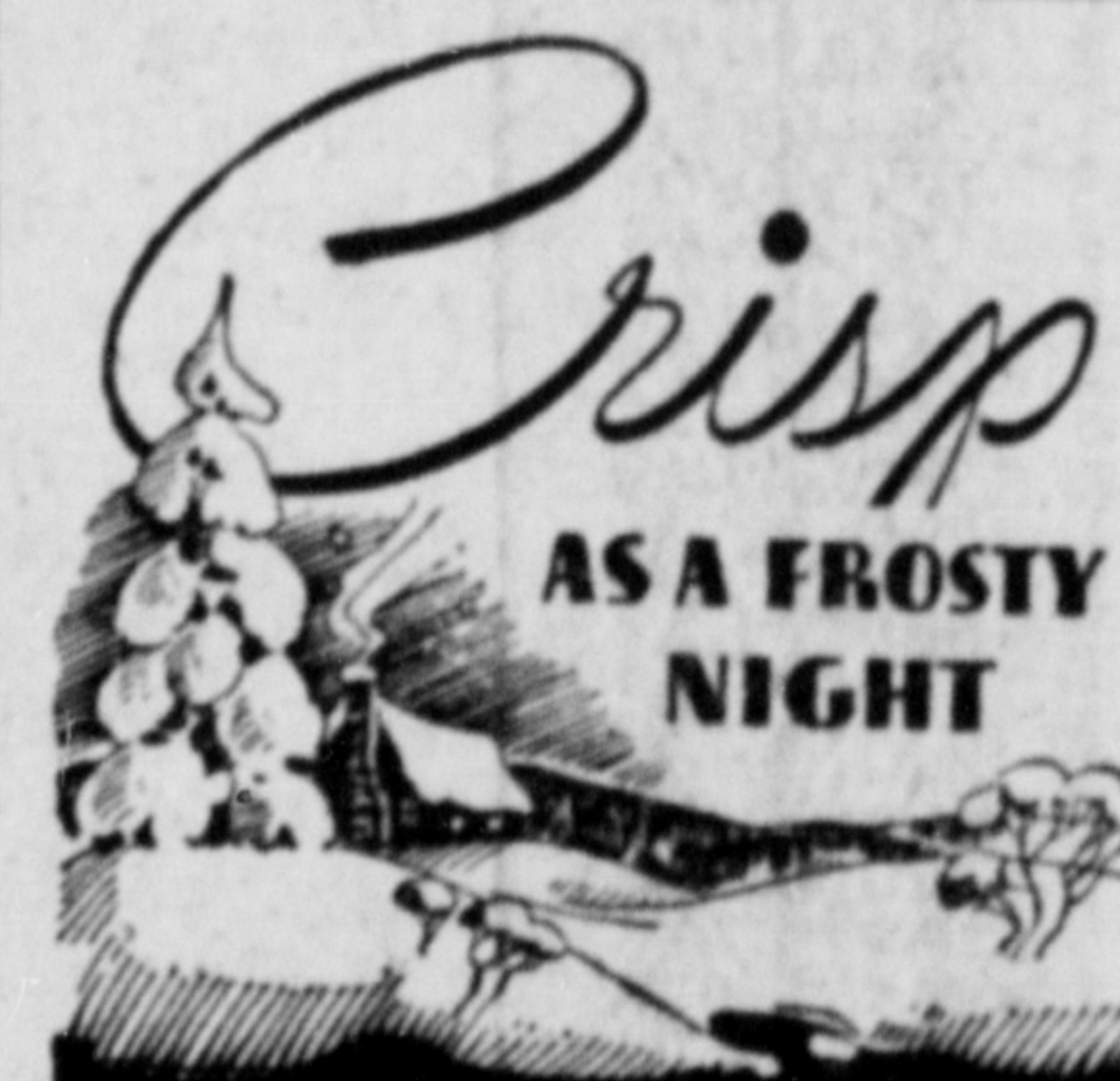
## LOCAL ITEMS
