VESTRY OF ST. PETER'S

Year of Successful Progressive Work
Shown in Annual Reports of Departments

Big Sunday School

Finances of Seal Cove Parish in Excellent Condition With All Debts Paid

At the annual meeting of the vestry of St. Peter's Church held last night the following officers were elected for the coming year:

W. O. Warden, J. E. Boddie, Secretary Treasurer and People's C. J. Norington, Clergyman's Warden, J. E. Boddie, Sidesmen—B. G. Beale, W. B. Skinner, George Kelsey and W. R. McAfee.

The reports received from the various departments showed considerable advance over previous years. The secretary-treasurer's report was outstanding. Besides having met all parochial expenses, missionary and other allied obligations to the full, the church had also paid the restoration fund appropriation with the exception of some sixteen dollars of which twelve dollars was already promised.

The Sunday School report read by Miss Thelma Skinner showed that there was a total enrollment of 165 children with 12 capable teachers, six men and six women. W. B. Skinner is the school superintendent. The finances of the school were in good shape, for, besides meeting all running expenses, the school had assisted missions to the extent of \$23.

A report from the Woman's Auxiliary read by Mrs. F. W. Stamp-Vincent showed a year of progressive effort, not only on behalf of St. Peter's which it had greatly helped but further afield through its affiliations.

A vote of thanks was passed to all those who had served the church and Sunday School in any way with particular reference to Walter Dalzell whose kindly efforts had been particularly appreciated.

ECLIPSE OF MOON
Astronomical Phenomenon Seen Here Perfectly on Saturday But Few Realized It.

Just before the white sphere disappeared in the western sky over the low horizon across the harbor, a total eclipse of the moon was visible perfectly in Prince Rupert on Saturday morning. The phenomenon was noted by many local persons who happened to be about at that time but the majority were probably unaware that it was an eclipse and possibly the best that has ever been seen here. Many people thought that it was caused by haze in the sky as there were some evidences of haze at the time.

The eclipse started at 6:03 a.m. with the period of totality from 7:47 a.m. to 8:31 a.m. It was the first total eclipse of the moon visible here since 1927.
